

We celebrated Founder's Day with Rev. Carolyn C. Cavaness preaching her first Founder's Day sermon here at Bethel titled "The House That Allen Built." Founder's Day is all about the life of Bishop Richard Allen and how he built the Methodist Church for Black Christians to worship freely.

Before Rev. Cavaness preached, we had a fantastic and distinguished speaker, **Dr. Richard Newman, Director of the Library Company of Philadelphia**. Dr. Newman was very honored to be at Bethel in that this was the first time he had been asked to keynote a Founder's Day event.

Dr. Newman spoke about the Main Line's influence on this movement and how Methodist preachers traveled as "circuit riders" to spread the Word of God in the suburbs. He also expressed his fondness of Allen and called him "his hero" for his tremendous impact not only in religious circles, but also in the community and in civic affairs, such as Allen's prominent role in the yellow fever epidemic.

After the morning worship service was over, we gathered in the Lawrence Johnson Social Hall for a question and answer session with Dr. Newman. We dined on a meal reminiscent of that era and the tables were adorned with crops that were eaten back in that period of time.

Dr. Newman, specializes in African American History and is the author of five books including "Freedom's Prophet" which he brought with him. Before Dr. Newman left we had a book signing session.

Our Founder's Day ended with a lecture and tour to the birthplace of the African Methodist Episcopal Church which included Mother Bethel AME Church and St. George's Methodist Church. A boxed lunch was provided and the bus was filled to its capacity with adults and many children. Much learning and fun was had by all.

Bethel Church and the **Lay Organization** continue to "grow and glow" in the name of God and we are enjoying the Reverend Carolyn Cavaness, our "first" female pastor, in the 120-year history of our church. She comes with many talents, new ideas and a strong leadership drive to lead us faithfully in worship and working with the community.
