

John the Baptist was preparing the way for Jesus, *And this was his message: After me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie.* 

Sister Bryant hit us with the Word of God, left and right supporting our charge for the "Laity, Fulfilling the Great Commission of African Methodist Episcopal Church."


After having a superb dinner prepared and served by a great kitchen staff, the officers and members waited in anticipation of our afternoon Concert. It took
