We also got to see where the worship services will be held, and the quest rooms. The accommodations are really nice. The hotel has only one restaurant but there are many eating places in walking distance of the hotel. It seems as though the rooms are booking quickly at the Marriott, so shortly Bethel, Lancaster will be giving a list of other hotels they are recommending in the area. When I get that information, I will pass on to you. The hotel group rate at the Marriott is \$120 per night and parking which is normally \$14 per day will be \$5 per day. "When Lay People Find Themselves In The Potters' House"

When you first step into the House of Worship of Bethel AMEC Ardmore, one will sense an atmosphere of spiritual reverence, expectation, and fellowship. This same type of atmosphere was prevailing in high gear when I, along with my husband Larry, arrived to join in on the celebration at Bethel's Annual Lay Day.

Under the perceptive and astute pastoral leadership of Reverend Albert Johnson and Lay President Sis. Louse Coursey, one could not help but to know that we were in for a traditional and long-established customary Annual Lay Day— one that was well planned with precision, pride, pomp and pleasure; and one that could very well continue to set a precedent for a Sunday Morning Lay Day in the Connectional AME Church.

Bro. Robinson's message invoked a deep sense of thought regarding our relationship with God as the lay of the church, as well as "the purpose" of a functioning Lay Organization, and the depth of our sincerity as we strive to be "meaningful vessels" for God and for all of God's people.
