Endow Manitoba campaign encourages people to give where they live

The Carberry and Area Community Foundation is participating in Endow Manitoba, a special campaign encouraging residents of Carberry and RM of North Cypress to consider a gift to their local community foundation during the month of November.

"Giving to a community foundation means giving back to your hometown forever," says Jim Marnoch, Chair of Carberry and Area Community Foundation. "It's a great opportunity to take care of a community and future generations. Endow Manitoba is a way to get the word out about what we do and how we can help people from all walks of life make a

Donations to a community foundation are pooled and permanently invested. The income earned on these investments is distributed each year to support local charitable needs in accordance with the donor's wishes. of interest, event or in memory of a relative or friend. The Foundation will acknowledge such gifts.

6. Multi-year pledge: You may make an initial contribution and a commitment to add to the initial donation over a period of years.
