Eastern Shore Presbyterian Ministries (ESPM)

ESPM was started in 2004 by the five (now only four) Presbyterian Churches on the Eastern Shore. We came to the realization that many students in our elementary schools did not have the required school supplies. In two schools 75% of the families live below the poverty level. We decided that our goal would be to provide sufficient supplies so that the schools would have them available for any child who was living below the poverty level. We plan to continue this extraordinary mission for 20 more years. A VERY special thank to George Heinrichs who has maintained this mission through all the 20 years and entrusted to Eva and gang this year.

YOUR donations MADE a HUGE difference! As always we are astounded with the funds our tiny churches on the Eastern Shore raise for the good of others. We did things a little different this year. We ordered online from a variety of vendors instead of local through Walmart. We ordered in bulk instead of retail. We decreased the number of items from 25 to 17. We applaud Eva Osborne for her commitment to research, order, store and arrange assembly for the mission this year! We thank her for the use of her garage. 2004 was the first year 2023 was our 20th year of completion. Below are the items bought and delivered to the seven schools. We brought the mission forward to June and the feedback was very positive from the schools. Below is the breakdown of items and the overall cost.


