



Eastern Shore Presbyterian Ministries school supply mission. (A ministry of 4 Presbyterian Churches)



ESPM was started in 2004 by the five (now only four) Presbyterian Churches on the Eastern Shore.

We came to the realization that many students in our elementary schools did not have the required school supplies. In two schools 75% of the families live below the poverty level.

We decided that our goal would be to provide sufficient supplies so that the schools would have them available for any child who was living below the poverty level. Please mark your checks ESPM and mail to PO Box 397 Onancock VA 23417

2023 total donations were close to \$6000. In 2024 our goal will be the same to meet the ever higher prices of supplies and delivery charges.

The savings balance is at \$2300 approximately. Last year we reorganized and had the phenomenal purchasing expertise of Eva Osborne. We not only met our goals for improvement, we have adopted this new format of purchase and delivery going forward. e have reorganized and we can't wait to send out an individual invitation to participate. The month of **April and May** will be our campaign to raise funds to order and **deliver supplies to the schools in June**.


