

Our NMPC congregation participates in the Christmas Joy Offering in December and the One Great Hour of Sharing around Easter. Because we support so many local missions we do not participate in the other two offered by PCUSA Mission agency. Both are worthwhile missions if you would like to support the October Special Offering here is the explanation: The Peace & Global Witness Offering in October supports the peacemaking and reconciliation efforts of the church at every governing body level and provides an opportunity to witness to God's gift of peace in the world. Gifts given to the Offering through a congregation are divided in the following manner: 25% is retained by congregations for support of their own peace and reconciliation efforts; 25% retained by mid-councils (12.5% presbytery/12.5% synod) for support of their own peace and reconciliation efforts; and 50% to the Mission Agency to provide assistance and resources for congregations to promote the peace of Christ. tled between the Atlantic Ocean and Chesapeake Bay, the Eastern Shore of Virginia National Wildlife Refuge serves as one of the country's most valuable stopovers for migratory birds and insects. Established in 1984, we are a haven for monarch butterflies, birds of prey and songbirds as they rest and refuel along their arduous journeys. With woodlands, shrublands, grasslands, saltmarsh, beach, and both fresh and brackish ponds it's no wonder that we host 34 mammal species and over 400 species of birds can be found in our area. Tours are offered every Saturday from October through February. **Please join the tour on October 19.** The tour introduces visitors to the unique variety of wildlife found on the island. As you pass through several habitats, you will learn about wildlife management on refuges, explore the diversity of wildlife, and discover the rich history of Fisherman's Island and the role it played during World War II.

Wildlife conservation is at the heart of the National Wildlife Refuge System. Nes-

Did You Notice a few things at NMPC?

Our choir has new robes thanks to fulfilling the remainder of the memorial money from several years ago. We have added to the pews New International Version large print bibles. We have added to the pews the purple Glory to God Hymnals that were introduced in 2013. The 1950 Revised Standard Bible is still in the pews as well as the blue Presbyterian hymnal from 1990.
