GLAD TIDINGS

Future Hope

I found this story from the Brazilian theologian Rubem Alves interesting. Let us consider the frontiers of our future in a way we may never have dreamed.

Rubem called hope "the suspicion ... that the frontiers of the possible are not determined by the limits of the present." Who among us doesn't sometimes imagine our future based solely on present-day obstacles? Even biblical heroes did so.

Abraham and Sarah laughed at God's promise of a child, seeing only their present circumstance of old age. Only in hindsight could Joseph see how God turned slavery in Egypt into great good. At first another Joseph, learning his fiancée was pregnant, believed his world was limited to two possibilities: shame Mary publicly or divorce her quietly. But his heart was open to God's message: "What is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. [Her] son ... will save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:20-21, NIV). How exceedingly far this future must have seemed from the limits of Joseph's present.

Christmas is a reminder that God calls us all into frontiers of the future we never could have dreamed!



Our Chrismon Tree Has New Life Thanks to Our Own Jean Beard!

Our Christmas tree in the narthex has a spectacular new look this yuletide season, thanks to the artistic talents of NMPC member Jean Beard. Jean has handcrafted dozens of new Chrismons for the tree, replacing the old Styrofoam ones that seen better days. Jean used felt fabric, sequins, beads, and embroidery in these beautiful new creations, which she has been working on since summer.

What's a Chrismon? Glad you asked. They're ornaments shaped into early Christian symbols — for example, a dove, a fish, a cross, a shepherd's crook, a chalice, and others. The tradition of the Chrismon tree, which



Ascension in Danville, created the first one. Today, churches around the world use them!

One of Jean's favorite symbols is the dogwood flower. "It represents the cross in its shape, and Jesus' sacrifice with the red tints on the flower petals," she says. "I also love the dove, which represents the presence of God."

Jean wasn't quite "alone" in her craftsmanship. She inherited all kinds of sequins and beads from her mother, Joyce, when she passed. "And I thought, I should use these."

Jean, who also makes <u>felt Christmas ornaments to sell at craft shows</u>, says she found the project "enjoyable and very gratifying. I'm very happy to use the sewing skills my mother taught me to create these for the church, something that can be used for many years."

And something we'll all enjoy for many years too. Thank you, Jean! By Mark Moring




Bible study followed by bag lunch and a business meeting.
