MESSAGE FROM PASTOR GOULD

Genesis 15:1-6

And God said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And Abraham believed the LORD; and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Many years ago I attended an event for leaders of the church. We were challenged to be sensitive to the call of God on our lives. Many of the group had lost their luster and joy for ministry because of declining congregations and members losing interest in the church and each other. As we worshiped together we gained a momentum and renewed joy together because of the Word of God put in vision we had not seen before.

We are all familiar with the call of Abraham to leave his home and the promise of becoming the father of many nations. But, Abraham, like many of us, lost his patience with this whole idea of a future full of hope and wonder.

So, God took him outside and showed him the heavens. God reminded him of all the wonder the sky provides.

As Abraham looked to the heavens God called upon him to be aware of the scale of potential that God had for him.

We were then shown this amazing video that the Hubble telescope took of a black hole. A space that had nothing there and nothing to offer—at least that's what the scientists thought at first. By looking into nothing but darkness the scientists discovered more universes than had ever been known before. It helps us ask the question for our own lives and the life of the church—As we stand outside and look to the heavens we can wonder about the *scale of potential that God has for us*. What stars are out there that are not visible? What stars are already visible but beyond our reach? What stars are out there that are not visible, but are waiting for us to discover?

May we look to the heavens in this fall to winter sky and allow God to show us our potential beyond our imagination.

SESSION DIGEST FROM CLERK OF SESSION NMPC...CLERK OF SESSION

Moderator Rev. Monica Gould said it was good to be home and she is offering Thanksgiving Dinner to anyone who would like to attend.

George Heinrichs is projecting income for the 2015 Budget of \$64,000. The budget will be voted on at Session next month and then presented at the Congregational and Corporate Meeting on December 7. Susan Grove and Jennifer Stapleton were scheduled to audit the church books on October 22.

The mission expenditures for 2014 were approved for disbursement in the amount of \$9,500. We will prepare a holiday meal for G.F. Horne again this year. The children will be involved in this year's Christmas program. More information will be forthcoming.

The Church Officer Nominating Committee recommended the following Ruling Elders for the Class of 2017: Linda Arvidson, Richard Freeman and John Humphreys. These folks were approved by Session and will be on the ballot at the Congregational Meeting. Many thanks to Rick Turner, Spencer Schuyler and Pam Nielsen for serving on the nominating committee.

Dick Freeman will work with Monica on the upcoming Stewardship Campaign. Dick, Rick, Debbie Ryon and Susan Grove (the Personnel Committee) worked hard to find us a new Minister of Music. The Session approved the proposed salary and vacation schedule. Susan will notify the applicant and follow up with a written contract. Rick is working hard on finding temporary musicians until the new person starts in December.

Rick Turner thanked Carol Rush for all her hard work on the Worship Committee and especially for recruiting ushers. Ushers need not be members of the church and there is no age restriction.

PRESBYTERY OF EASTERN VIRGINIA MEETING NOTES BY JODY HUMPHREYS

PEVA met at the Makemie Woods Camp and Conference Center on Tuesday October 28. Rev. Monica Gould introduced herself to the 100 attendees and was appointed as the Temporary Clerk for the day. October was Clergy Appreciation Month and clerks of session were invited to enter letters of appreciation into a contest. Rev. Dr. Donald Broad won one of the 6 gifts based on the letter Belle Haven PC wrote.

The Transitional General Presbyter told about how Rev. Bill Moore from Powelleton PC worked as a first responder when the tornado hit the Eastern Shore. She remembered how he later preached about God adapting us and our witness for grace under fire and how we never know when our skillset will be needed. Rev. Dr. Liza Hendricks also talked about one of the PEVA churches that elected a 16 year old as Elder for Mission and Vision. The Vision he came up with was "Ordinary People Serving an Extraordinary God." Rev. Hendricks encouraged all of us to use all the resources at our disposal, including our youth.

PEVA approved a 2015 budget of \$1,192,099 based on anticipated church giving of \$700,000. Monica was received from the Ohio Valley Presbytery and her installation was noted. Rev. Frances Makemie (Anthony Burcher) brought greetings to the Presbytery and noted that he was an author of 6



books, one on youth. The Makemie Woods Camp report noted the contribution of new lights for the dining room from the Joe's Gang. PEVA voted to have a called meeting on February 24, 2015 to determine the future of the Makemie Woods Camp and Conference Center.

FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE...TALENT, TIME AND TRIBUTE

November is the month when our session's financial committee begins the process of preparing the operating budget for the following year. As we enter into this process of discernment we request your prayers.

A mission trip for youth and adults is also part of this summer's plan. All these opportunities are things for the future we are excited about. Our goal is to be good stewards of all the blessings God has given us. As we approach this new season of giving please prayerfully consider what God is calling you to give through your gifts and your time.
