2020 was an unusual year (no one needs me to say that), and we had to cancel our Daffodil Show due to the pandemic. As luck would have it, we all had amazing daffodils last Spring. Many vases of daffs graced our houses, and I took masses of flowers to the hospital to put in patient's rooms. It was unusual to have so many on hand, not being kept for the bench or the Club Collection or an artistic entry, but wow, what beautiful blooms! And how wonderful to just enjoy them.

Though we were not able to hold the fall Annual Meeting in person, the new slate of officers and board members for 2020-2022 was approved by the membership, and I'm thrilled about this fabulous group. The Silver Medal of the American Daffodil Society is awarded to an individual deemed by the Honors Committee as being worthy of recognition of outstanding service to the ADS. The 2020 winner is **Mitch Carney**, of Boonsboro, MD. Mitch has been National Show Chairman at multiple Conventions, has taught a number of Judging Schools and Refreshers, and serves on several ADS Committees. Space limitations prevent a fuller description of Mitch's accomplishments — learn more about him at daffodilusa.org, under 'ADS Silver Medal Recipients'.

The ADS John & Gertrude Wister Award

is given in recognition of daffodils that are floriferous, long bloomers with vigorous foliage and tall sturdy stems, resistant to rot and readily available. Emphasis is on garden performance, though the winner may also be of show quality. The 2021 winner is 'Marieke' (1 Y-GYY), a 1986 Konijnenburg & Mark hybrid, with a

big, upward facing flower with a long, dark yellow trumpet and a vivid yellow perianth. Blooms are graceful, long lasting and lightly scented.



The ADS William G. Pannill Award

is given to an American hybridizer to recognize a named standard daffodil that has demonstrated winning show qualities for a minimum of 5 years following registration. The 2020 winner is 'Pogo' (3 W-GYO, registered in 1989, bred by Mrs. Goethe (Helen) Link



[14/3BY/1YY Seedling x First Kiss. Beautiful mid-to-late season bloom with a white perianth and a small bowlshaped corona with a green center fading to yellow. Striking intermediate for both the garden and show.

Pauline Vollmer, an accomplished horticulturalist whose Baltimore County garden became a much-visited and photographed example of the Oehme/VanSweden 'New American Garden', died January 12 at the age of 104. Her garden was first planted in the 1960's and contained both natives and rare plants underused at the time.

Garden club members remember Pauline as a lover of people and pets, who generously shared her breadth of knowledge and talent freely. Pauline taught many novices how to arrange flowers, and sponsored the MDS Mrs. Leo J. Vollmer Award presented at each MDS show to the design demonstrating the most effective use of daffodils. Pauline's generous gift to Cylburn Arboretum was the impetus for its Vollmer Center, dedicated in 2010 and a model of green technology and in the use of sustainable materials. She will be remembered as a woman of many talents and achievements, in and out of the gardening world.
