Course II, ADS Judging School to be held Thursday, April 17, 2025

Course II of the three-course process to become an ADS judge will be conducted on Thursday, April 17, 2025 at the Greenhouse Classroom at Cylburn Arboretum, 4915 Greenspring Ave., Baltimore MD 21209. While the course is a requirement for prospective daffodil judges, anyone who wants to learn more about daffodils is encouraged and welcome to take this one-day class. Courses do not need to be taken in order.

Judges Accreditation Requirements are:

- 1. Hold a current membership with the ADS.
- 2. Pass all the ADS judging schools with a score of at least 75% in each section of the school.
- 3. Grow at least 100 different daffodil cultivars, species and miniatures from at least eight divisions.
- 4. Serve as a student judge at three or more ADS approved shows with a favorable evaluation from the Accredited Judge who supervised the experience.
- 5. Exhibit daffodils in ADS approved shows for at least three years.
- 6. Win at least five blue ribbons over the course of three years in ADS approved shows. One blue ribbon needs to be for a collection. A red or yellow ribbon with 90+ score is acceptable.

The cost for Course II is \$25.00, and will cover snacks, lunch and costs associated with conducting the class. Interested? Please email or call the class registrar, Julie Minch, julesmin@gmail.com, 410-303-6536.



ADS William G. Pannill Award Winner for 2024 'Tom Terrific' (11 Ya

Y-O), left. Bred by Dr. John Reed and registered in 2007, it's a mid-season, split corona, intermediate size bloom with heavy substance. The Pannill Award is given annually to an American hybridizer to recognize a named standard daffodil which has demonstrated winning show qualities for a minimum of five years following registration. The cultivar must have been awarded at least one ADS Gold or White Ribbon within the last five years, and it must be regarded as generally "growable and showable" in a majority of the ADS regions.



ADS John and Gertrude Wister Award Winner for 2024 'Bantam' (2 Y-

YOO), left. Registered before 1950 and hybridized by Barr and Sons (UK), this intermediate sized daffodil is late-blooming, and a garden standout. It's included with ADS Classics and ADS Intermediate special classes. Criteria for the award are that the cultivar must be a readily available good grower with a floriferous habit, a showy long lasting bloom and vigorous, disease -resistant foliage, with a stem taller than foliage, and resistant to basal rot and bulb splitting. Emphasis is on garden performance, though it may be of show table quality.

Minutes of the 2023 Fall Meeting of the Maryland Daffodil Society
The Meeting took place on Saturday, November 4, 2023 at the Greenhouse Classroom at Cylburn Arboretum, 4915 Greenspring Ave., Baltimore, MD 21209, and was called to order by President Muffin McAfee at 1:39 PM. 23 persons were present.
Minutes of the 2022 Fall Meeting were approved as printed in the March and October 2023 newsletters.
Treasurer's Report (detailed report filed with these Minutes). Jackie Handley presented the following: Beginning balance 9/28/22 \$17,156.49, Income to 9/30/23 \$5,275.30, Expenses to 9/30/23 (\$5,572.21), Ending balance 9/30/23 \$16,859.58 Certificate of Deposit of \$5,189.46 renewed for 6 months in May.
<u>President's Report:</u> Muffin welcomed attendees, thanked Meredith McDonagh, her team and over 50 volunteers for a successful 2023 show with 409 entries and 787 blooms. She thanked Anne Donnell Smith, Leslie Aronson, Olivia Welbourn, Don Caton, Julie Minch and WDS for coordinating or contributing to today's bulb sale. Muffin introduced Deana Kozak, ADS Regional Vice-President, who announced that the winner of the Mid-Atlantic Leadership and Service Award is Nancy Fuchs of the Virginia Daffodil Society.
Committee Reports:
 Membership. Chair Julie Minch reported that prior to today, 25 individuals paid dues for 2023 – 2024. Nominating Committee. Chair Pat Parker reported that she, Mary Ann Thompson and Sally Waller are working to fill positions for the term beginning October 2024, and urged members to consider serving in a leadership position if asked. MDS Show Committee. Muffin reported that a committee consisting of herself, Sherry Jordan, Catherine Max, Pat Parker and Sally Waller will chair the 2024 show; Meredith McDonagh will be available to consult. Muffin introduced new member Meghan Pace who helped with dismantling in 2023, and presented her with 'Little Meg' bulbs donated by Don Caton. Meredith asked previous volunteers to recommit for the <i>April 16 - 18, 2024 show</i>, at the Vollmer Center, Cylburn Arboretum.
New Business:
 ADS Judges School. Julie Minch announced that ADS Judges School Course 1 will be held on Wednesday, April 3, 2024, in the Greenhouse Classroom at Cylburn. The course also serves as a judge's refresher. All interested persons are welcome; taking the exam is not required unless the student wishes to become a judge, and in that case, Julie will try to place the student as a clerk or student judge in MDS show/s. ADS Convention. Julie announced that the ADS National Convention and Show will be held at the Hyatt Regency Dulles (VA), April 10 – 13, 2024, and encouraged members to register for convention tours and lectures, and to volunteer and enter blooms, floral designs and photographs.
