Memberships- It was brought up to increase the membership prices to help counter expenses.

Increase individual membership from \$20 to \$25 and Family membership was \$30 and will change to \$45 this was second then moved to amend and move from \$45-50 – seconded and passed

\*We will still move forward with arena improvements as far as finishing the outdoor arena project and having Al Campbell come back this spring. The Fairgrounds crew recognizes the safety concerns. We would love to hold another arena improvement fundraiser race again next year to help finish this project. Comments?

We will continue seeking panel sponsors until our panel project is complete (need around 30 more for completion)

We plan to have Al Rock Dawg LLC come back this spring with his rock machine. This fee will be much cheaper as a maintenance fee vs his initial fee last year.

\*Stephanie has submitted the ODA paperwork for approval to be able to hold our January 4<sup>th</sup> play day. At this point we are allowed to move forward with a lot of safety regulations. We will be asking for your and your horse's information at pre-entries as we must keep documentation of every horse during the event. Please do not bring extra horses if you can avoid it until this has

passed. We will have to have a vet on call in case a horse becomes sick as well as having an isolation area ready. Please be patient with us as we will have to get more information from you all and will need to follow all the rules from the state of Oregon to be able to hold our events. We do appreciate all the safety concerns and will be following them all as safety is our first priority. There are currently 0 cases in Oregon and if anything changes, we will update everyone immediately.

\*We want to thank Taylor Brant for all of her hard work representing MSGC this past year. She did a fantastic job. We want to also welcome our 2026 MSGC Queen Megan Caldwell and our new 2026 MSGC Princess Grace Beamer. We are so excited to have them represent our club in 2026!

\*At last year's meeting, we voted to offer a lead line class for our 8 and under kids needing assistance on the pattern. They had 2 events instead of 3 and a shorter pattern. From the office point of view, this seems to have been really good for the kids this year and we would love to continue offering this class. Any feedback? Keep the lead line class for 2026 everyone agreed this was a great change for our littles in 2025

\*It was brought up to get rid of the intermediate class for 2026 and change the ages in the open class to 19-44 years of age and change the Jack Benny class for 50+ to 45+

This was seconded and the majority voted this change.

**Classes will be:**

Lead line- 0-8 MUST BE LEAD ONLY

Peewee 0-8

Junior 9-13

Open 19-44

Jack Benny 45+

Lead line rule: These rules must be followed for your child to be in this class.

0-8 years old. Must be led by an adult through the whole pattern. No being led from another horse (ponying). You may not let your child go to run home on their own. The child needs to cross the eyes before the leader does. These rules are in place for your child's safety and fairness for everyone.

\*BHA side pot- discussion on this (Ruth can talk about details) make sure everyone understands how it works and get feedback how we can improve make bigger/better for next year??

We will continue to partner with BHA. You must be a MSGC AND BHA member to receive your side pot awards.

BHA wants to go MSGC prime for her races. So, anyone who enters her races will pay \$1 fee. BHA then writes MSGC a check. With these funds they will go towards our year end MSGC/BHA side pot awards This is also an opportunity for MSGC to be able to sponsor a BHA buckle for their finals without taking from our awards budget.
