1. Build a Prayer-focused Team Culture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Classroom prayer time: There is an appointed bible study every week and devotions every day. Whether it's before or after class Prayer partners – Pair up the advisers as prayer partners. It's about building deep, personal connections and accountability. Prayer Requests – make sharing prayer requests a regular habit. Tell the advisers to share the prayer requests in person, via email, or through a group chat and create a culture where prayer is the norm, not the exception. Lyrics should be biblically sound, promoting a healthy understanding of God. Congregational engagement: pick songs that the classroom knows and loves. Keep most of your setlist familiar to encourage participation. Musicality: choose songs within the class skill level. Everyone should leave knowing exactly what's expected of them.• Clear role expectations: every team member needs to know their role – both during services and rehearsals. Clarity here is non-negotiable.• Constructive Feedback: a culture where feedback isn't feared but embraced. The team will grow and evolve together• Open line of Communication: keep communication channels open so that every team member feels heard, valued and unstoppable. A short reflection on a Bible verse or a time of personal sharing can be transformative.• Discipleship Trainings of teachers: regular bible studies the team dive deeper into God's word and grow in their understanding• Mentorship: encourage experienced team members to mentor students/teachers. It promotes spiritual growth but also strengthens team unity.
