Donley Auctions held a four day auction. This was the auction for you if you were looking for a unique, one-of-a-kind gift for the holidays. Something for everyone! Quality antique and vintage and antique items that included but were not limited to advertising signs, cabinets and displays, children's items, furniture, lamps and sconces, stained glass, large selection of walking canes, music related, Schwinn bicycles, soda fountain, general store, tobacciana, petroliana

A very unusual Arts & Crafts style oak bar & back bar with a storied history. It was built in 1909 & carries brass builder nameplates for A.F. Meyer, Bar, Fixtures, Beer Pumps, 408 Broadway Buffalo, N.Y.

The back bar measured 25' wide which included crown, 10'-7" tall, 22' deep that did not include

crown. The upper part of the back bar featured sliding leaded glass doors. The left side had an open 6' wide jug rack with shelves. The center of the back bar had 3 mirrors, the center mirror was capped with a leaded glass scene of a European castle & was lit from behind. The right side of the back bar had large sliding glass doors with wood shelving for liquor storage. The bottom center of the back bar had clear glass doors with tiered storage/bottle display, the center door had the original ice block compartment for cooling. The back bar had 5 square Arts & Crafts style leaded glass shades that lighted up. All the leaded glass on the back bar was in very good condition with no missing pieces. The back bar ends were both finished & the wood retained its old original finish. Back bar was in very good overall condition.

The front of the bar measured 26" wide, 43" tall, 28" deep. The oak paneled front sported a solid mahogany top which had some recent professional repairs.

The bottom of the front bar had an 8' marble base & a brass foot rail. The left side of the front bar had an unusual 4' wide built in tobacco case with a glass top & front. The front bar had the original finish with the exception of the top which was ready for refinishing. Also included was business cards & paper ephemera that was found in the back bar drawers from the Club Rom-Way days of operation. The front bar & back bar breaks down into components, sold for \$20,000.

and a large collection of framed celebrity autographs.

We had a very unusual Arts and Crafts style oak bar and back bar with a storied history. It was built in 1909 and carried brass builder nameplates for A.F. Meyer Bar, Fixtures, Beer Pumps, 408 Broadway Buffalo, N.Y.

This is the unique timeline of the bar history. The building was located at 1334 Broadway, Buffalo, New York (corner of Broadway and Rommel). In 1900 Buffalo had the highest Polish population in the U.S. and this area of Buffalo was known as Polonia.

The building was designed for Stanislaus & Katarzyna Tomaszewski by prolific Polish-American architect Wladyslaw H. Zawadzki. The permit to build was issued on November 24th, 1909. The bar and backbar were built by A.F. Meyer, 408 Broadway, Buffalo, NY. August Meyer was a builder and supplier of saloon bars, soda fountains, and store fixtures. In 1910 Buffalo City Guide lists Stanislaus Tomaszewski as operator of a saloon at this location.

In 1920 on January 17th, Prohibition started and the saloon closed. In 1920 Benjamin Szewczyk and his wife Mary purchased the building and opened Benny's Grill. Benny's Grill would become a notorious speakeasy during prohibition. From 1926 to 1933 the bar would be raided five times with violations ranging from bartending to distilling whiskey and spirits and each time they would pay the \$250 fine and open again. In 1933 on December 5th, Prohibition officially ended. After Prohibition, Benny transformed his tavern into a legitimate restaurant and bar and ran it until 1943.

In 1943 Peter A. Niciszewski and his brother-in-law Raymond S. Raczky bought the business and opened Club Rom-Way, a contraction of the location at the corner of Rommel and Broadway. They featured live country western bands and became well known for their New Year's Eve parties. In December of 2004 after 60 years in business, Niciszewski closed Club Rom-Way. In 2005 Niciszewski passed away in January at the age of 90.

In 2006 the bar was removed from the building. In 2007 the building was purchased at a delinquent tax sale. Which brings us to the sale of the very unusual Arts and Crafts style oak bar and back bar that sold for, \$20,000.

The auction also encompassed original art from Playboy cartoonist Marty Murphy and Playboy memorabilia to include Hugh Hefner's suits and pin-up girl calendars and Wallendorf porcelain nudes.
