





"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany continued to work towards a more normal pattern of ministry. We are beginning to meet for Sunday School. Our ladies are meeting on Tuesday evenings at 6:30 for a video Bible study by Jen Wilkin ("Better" - Hebrews). Our congregation approved a search committee to identify candidates for an associate pastor. We will hold our annual Fall Bible Conference October 2-4 with speaker Dr. Brad Klassen, an instructor at The Master's Seminary. Pastor Bowen continues to preach through the Gospel of John on Sunday mornings.

Bethlehem: Greetings from Bethlehem Baptist. The summer this year has been quit different for us, as most of the churches. We are very thankful that we are able to go to church and have live services to praise our God. Our pastor Jason has given us some great sermons to help us through the crazy weeks. We must remember, prayers and talking to God will get you through anything. Have a

Broadway: Since Sedalia Broadway Church "re-opened for business," the congregation is slowly returning, but they ARE returning. People from churches which still remain closed attend also. We offer prayers regularly that people will not be fooled into fear because we know that God has not given us a spirit of fear (2 Timothy 1:7). Sunday school classes continue in the LifeWay series on Hebrews. On Sunday evening, in the adult Bible study on Discipleship also from LifeWay, we will soon begin Book Three, Your Life as a Disciple (explore Bible reading, praying, relying on the Holy Spirit).

Calvary: Our Calvary family filled out a survey to work in areas of service they would like to serve in the coming year. Calvary's council will be selecting 3 members to serve the coming year to replace the members that have served their terms. A decision was made in the best interest of our Calvary family to postpone the Sunday evening service during this pandemic of the Coronavirus. We continue to worship in person each Sunday morning at 8am and 10am on line. Calvary's volunteers helped with Meals on Wheels this month. The Midweek prayer and Bible study with Pastor Don was virtual. We will open up for gathering as soon as the virus is safe to meet again. Calvary's Crew (youth) met every Wednesday night during the month of August. Our choir, with Michael Sproles, has been postponed until we can gather again. Our monthly men's breakfast, held on the first Saturday of the month, has been postponed. Pastor Don encouraged those that have the capability to watch the Bible Study lesson that Pastor Jonathan is teaching online every Tuesday at 10:00 am on our website, calvarybaptistsedalia.org Sunday School. He is doing a great job sharing the Word of God.

East Sedalia: We are proud of a bench made for the west alcove of the church. Two cornerstones from the old church were used for the base and boards placed on the top to make the bench complete. Adult Bible study is being held on campus every Wednesday morning at 11:00 A.M. In the Wednesday evening Bible Study on line we are now studying in the book of Acts that began on July 29. Rev. Tim Smith and Melody were on vacation in Alabama in July. We were saddened to hear of Melody's father's death, Glenn Jennings, while they were there. In Brother Tim's absence Rev. David Owens supplied on July 26 and Rev. Eddie Brown supplied on Aug.2. The children and youth of the church graciously received packets in August delivered to their homes from their teachers and leaders. The August distribution of food served 190 persons. We are so thankful for those that are able to obtain the food that is so much needed, and for those faithful workers who see that it is prepared and placed in each person's car individually.

FBC Sedalia: On August 9 we called our new Senior Pastor, Jeremiah Greever and his wife Sadie and son Judah. His first Sunday with us will be October 4. Bittersweet news is that our Interim Pastor Greg Morrow's last Sunday with us will be September 20. Long-time church secretary, Twila Simons, resigned recently.
