

I'm the Executive Director of the Embassy men's recovery program (some know us as a "sober living house").

We are a non profit organization that requires our participants to sign a 6 month commitment to graduate.

The embassy currently owns 2 houses with a total of 21 beds. We run agt full capacity and are turning countless men away. Men that are begging us and our community for the help of obtaining the tools, skills and understanding of a new life.

We are designed to serve men over 18 that are coming out of D.O.C., out of homelessness, and out of the couch hopping syndicate, of which, struggle with substance use disorder.

As society continues to fall, The Embassy continues to build solutions in men.

OUR PROBLEM: We need more space to add beds to stop turning so many away.

OUR SOLUTION: A few months ago, the Embassy was gifted with a very large property with exactly what we are looking for in facilities (once renovations are complete). Once completed, we will be able to easily and comfortable be able to expand our reach to include over 50+ beds.

OUR NEED: We need financial donations of any size to be able to get the 1st phase of this expansion project complete (Materials and labor). This 1st phase will require approximately \$75,000.
