



Broadway: At Broadway Baptist, Pastor Gray's August sermon series was on the End Times. Several contacts were made and supplies and backpacks given to grade school kids.

New Hope: New Hope's youth attended Super Summer at Hannibal La-Grange University this year. We took 17 youth and 3 leaders and had 3 commitments to Christ. We participated in the Baptist tent on the first Friday evening of the State Fair, with many showing up to share the gospel and give out tracts and Bibles. A lock-in for youth girls was held at the church on August 23, with 24 girls and 4 women attending. Girls of Grace sought to teach them what a godly girl looks like and how to be Christ-like in a Christ-less world. The Trustees have scheduled a Work Day for Saturday, Sep 14, from 7 am to 2 pm. Breakfast and lunch will be available. New Hope's Women's Ministry will host a Priscilla Shirer Going Beyond simulcast Saturday, September 21, from 9 am to 3 pm. Doors will open at 8:30 am. Cost and registration information will be available soon. Impact Youth is hosting a drive-thru prayer on the church parking lot from 2-4 pm on Saturday, September 28. David and Belinda Hogan will be our guest speakers during the morning service at 10:40 am on Sunday, Sep 29. They will talk about the impact Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes have in sharing the gospel with children and their families around the world. Our annual picnic at Bothwell Lodge will be held the same day from 4-7 pm. New Hope will lead Cross Connect at Olive Branch on Saturday, October 5.
