Message from the Association Cooperation Committee

Hello Associated Churches!

The committee approved at the Annual Meeting in September is studying our cooperation and will bring recommendations to the Executive Board. We started this process with an online survey of pastors and church leaders and have done our best to get feedback from as many of our churches as we could. Overall, we had 16 survey responses and several phone calls getting feedback on our Association. We want to give you an update from some of the feedback.

Our committee is now working on recommendations from these results and from research about other associations. We plan on presenting these recommendations at the next Executive Board Meeting scheduled on Feb 2, 2026.

Survey Results Summary:

- **Kids Camp** and possibly Youth Camp is our primary winner for cooperation. Improving communication, participation and overcoming parent concerns need to be addressed.
- **Improving communication** between churches using more effective newsletter format or distribution system. Could this be done via the association website? Could the newsletter be better distributed to church members directly?
- **Missions and Outreach** are another opportunity. Providing evangelism or outreach opportunities is a common request. This could be accomplished with the State Fairgrounds annual tent, shared mission trips, church planting, etc. On the outreach side, could there be joint efforts for website updates, and online presence which could be used? Our rural churches likely need the support to get a vision for marketing themselves online and how a website is one of the main ways to reach new visitors.
- **Pulpit Supply** and the Preaching Series can continue as training grounds for future pastors/preachers.
- **Better expectations of support and resources for churches who do not have a pastor.** There are difficulties with the autonomy of the local church here but some churches would like more support from the association when they are between pastors. Developing guidelines for what the association offers and does not offer during a pastoral vacancy would be clarified.
- Having a **DOM who is the primary preaching pastor in his local church** seems to be a barrier for him being able to connect with the other churches in the association.
- Working to communicate the **value of associational giving and participation.** As much as possible the local church members need access to knowledge of ministry opportunities and ministry relationships with associational staff.

All-Church Worship will meet at 6 pm on Wed, Dec 31. Mid-week activities will not be held that evening.

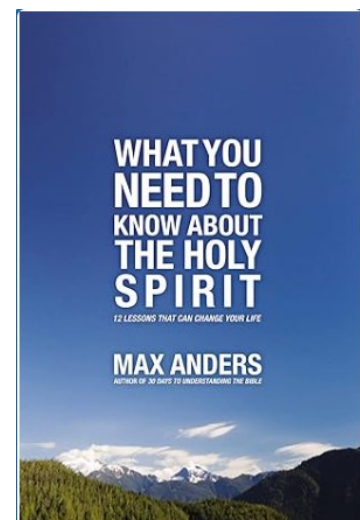
Book Review

On July 7, 1873, Charlotte “Lottie” Moon was appointed as a missionary to China. With a bold spirit and a heart full of love for the Lord, she dedicated her life to sharing the gospel with the people of China – faithfully serving until her passing on December 24, 1912.

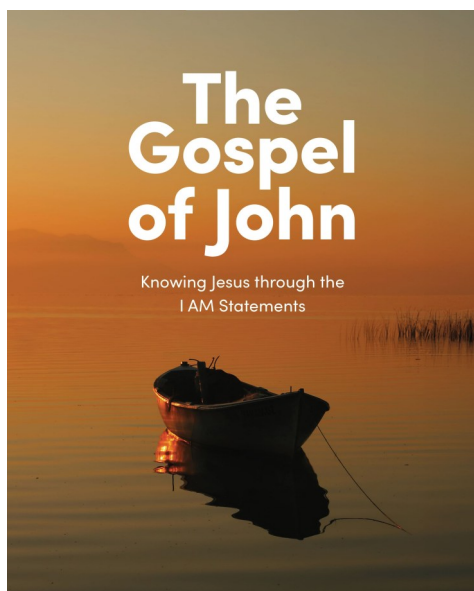
