"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Bethany: The saints at Bethany began November by witnessing two baptisms and sharing the Lord's Supper. The ladies concluded their Fall Bible Study. The Men's Morning Fellowship met on the 14th and the 28th. We collected items for the shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child. Our choir started practicing for our annual Christmas Eve service. Our deacons and their lovely wives met for a dinner fellowship on the 14th. We started work on our first-ever float entry for the Sedalia Christmas Parade. We gathered together for a Thanksgiving Dinner Fellowship on the 22nd. Pastor Bowen continued his exposition of Romans on Sunday mornings and we enjoyed a video series on "Meaningful Manhood" by Pastor Tony Evans on Sunday evenings. Calvin and Jill Inman were present in our morning service on the 29th. Calvin preached as we prepared for the annual Lottie Moon emphasis.

Broadway: We continue to be excited about our user-friendly website broadwaybaptistsedalia.org. We added a slideshow about our Trunk and Treat event, including the statement that we were not celebrating Halloween but providing an alternate opportunity. Fourteen adults were involved. We distributed about 200 bags of candy and tracts. Children's Church presented their study of the Armor of God including their "handmade" armor. OASIS group had a successful get acquainted event. During Advent, our lighted entryway will contain the Nativity Scene to witness to 50 Highway travelers. Beginning in January, Sunday evening service at 6:30 pm will be Christian videos: missionary lives, Biblical subjects, marriage and family matters, religions of the world. <u>Calvary</u>: We stood on street corners and held signs supporting adoption over abortion. We had an article in the Sedalia Democrat telling about our church remodeling. Pastor Don gave short messages to the residents in Fair View Nursing Home and Rest Haven Convalescent and Retirement Home. The Men's Breakfast and Forever Young group meetings had good attendance. We were saddened that George Cooper, a deacon, left his earthly home and entered his heavenly home. We had a Friendship Connection Day on the 15th. We held our annual Thanksgiving meal. Two Brownie and Girl Scout troops helped fill Operational Christmas Child shoe boxes. We had the "Hanging of the Green" on November 22. Our exercise classes met every Monday and Thursday in Fellowship Hall. We had a fifth Sunday sing. We baptized eight on November 8

East Sedalia: In honor of Veteran's Day, Charlie Palmer gave his testimony of his service in World War II in the Sunday morning service. It was most interesting and informative. Veterans were recognized from all military branches. A goal of \$1500 was set for the Lottie Moon Offering. The church-wide Thanksgiving Fellowship Dinner, sponsored by the deacons, was held on November 18. A large crowd attended and enjoyed the bountiful meal prepared by the Social Committee. Rev. 
