

We operate a lean budget, and achieve healthy results. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, Board Members, United Way, and grant contributors, we are changing lives and improving the overall literacy skills of our clients!

We were extremely honored to have support from our community clubs. We received a \$5,000 grant from Siemer Milling and \$2,500 from Dollar General to further our mission statement, "Building Bridges to learning".

Many volunteers supported our financial need by participating in the "Shred Day" program sponsored by Service One Credit Union. Board members, parents, students and other volunteers helped with our financial endeavor.

Dyslexia Association hosted its Trivia Event – which was a HUGE success! Just another way we are getting our name out into the community.






FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS


A few of our financial highlights include:

- Ended the year with net income over \$4,693.00
- Gross income exceeded \$55,000
- Grant income increased 50% from previous year

WHAT'S NEXT?

It is vital this coming year that we continue to "Build Bridges to Reading".

My primary goals for the coming year are:

- ❖ Continue to offer the Barton Reading & Spelling Program in the Special Education Resource Class. We will train teachers from Hopkinsville Middle School. This partnership with Christian County Public Schools will be in coordination with Corey Batey, Academic & Compliance Coach.
- Guarantee significant learning experiences by being part of the Christian County Public Schools District Literacy Team.
- ❖ Partner with the Boys & Girls Club, Challenge Houses, Pryme Tyme and other groups and distribute literacy books that are high interest low reading level for struggling readers in the community.
- ❖ Make connections with various groups in our area (i.e., Kiwanis, Rotary, Lions, New Comers, & etc.) to give presentations about dyslexia during their meetings.
- Provide Professional Development to area schools (both public and private schools) by conducting a 3-hour Dyslexia Simulation to participants.
- Strengthen our financial position by investigating alternative funding sources to create more stable funding for our organization in the future.
