I know Roth's will do their very best to make sure we have a great meal. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone there!




awards." Frank and Sharon Munz also won an award with their beautiful truck.




"Best of Show" 1930 Ford Delivery Sedan-owners, Ralph and Carolyn Roll, Hillsboro, OR.

This is one of the nicest bbq's of the summer. Beautiful green grass, it's in the late afternoon/ evening and the weather is always just




