Each month I print fifty copies of the agenda and at the end of the meeting someone goes around the room and picks up at least half of them that have been left on the table.



Hello WVSR members,

2022 invoices for membership dues were emailed out the first part of October. We know some of you like to get it done early while others wait till the last minute and either way is fine **as long as they are in by January 1st.** Dues are \$25.00 for the 2022 calendar year, however the invoice includes a \$1.00 processing fee for online payment. Once you have your invoice you can choose to pay via three options:

1. Pay your dues in person at a club meeting for \$25.00
2. Mail a \$25.00 check to P.O. Box 4091 Salem, OR 97302
3. Pay \$26.00 electronically, the invoice is sent via PayPal, however you do not need a paypal account to make a payment.
4. If you have already paid your dues just ignore the invoice. You'll be removed from the reminder list as updates come in.
- 5.. If you don't get an invoice, check your spam folder, and if you accidentally delete it, or just never get one, a link on our website will become available on the 'Club Info' page to pay \$26.00 online.

Talk about "unique"! Attending the *Unique Street & Car Culture Show* that was a part of the *15th Annual Salem Roadster Show* in September, I ran across a vehicle I had never seen before. My friends and fellow club members Rod and Sandy Beach were invited to show their "Tribute" car.

SgtMaj Rodney Beach has designed, built, and will race this car at Bonneville Speedway to help our fellow veterans! The *Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde* are receiving donations to be handed to the Veterans Committee to be used for assisting veterans in need. The donated money goes directly to the committee, SgtMaj Beach will not accept any donation handed to him to avoid any hint of impropriety! All checks must be made payable to the *Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde* and mailed directly by the donor. Cash donations are referred and handed to a third party that converts the cash to check form and mails it to the Veterans Committee.

The car is beautifully painted and adorned with graphics and tributes to the fallen. Above the drivers door in white, block letters reads "ROD BEACH" with the passenger door roof reading "Sandy Beach".

What a great gift to the veterans in need that benefit from the donations! Decisions on the fund recipients are the sole discretion of the Veteran's Committee of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde. Any veteran in need can contact the tribe.
