Goodguys Hall of Fame Road Tour 2024

Darrel Williams (a member of the Flywheels Car Club) and I recently participated in the 2024 Hall of Fame Road Tour. Starting in Rapid City, SD on September 8 and ending in Boise, ID on September 14. This trip, our 4th time we've done the tour, we drove my 1936 Ford Cabriolet, traveling a total of 3,548 miles.

We left Silverton Monday afternoon September 2 headed for Loveland Co. and the Goodguys Colorado Nationals to be held Sept. 6-8. Rest stops and Rain was the theme the first two legs of the trip





with stops in Pendleton and Twin Falls, ID. We ran into some rain again on Wednesday afternoon near Laramie WY. Thursday the 5th we traveled with a group of about 20 cars north to WyoTech in Laramie for a tour of their trade school. It's a a 9 month program teaching automotive classes in body work, welding, painting, diesel mechanics and related. They have a current enrollment of over 1,000 students. It's a very impressive school with great facilities and staff. Generally speaking, graduating students have jobs waiting for them if they want them.

Friday and Saturday we attended the Goodguys car show in Loveland. It was held at a very nice facility with lots of grass and shade. We met two couples from southern OR who had driven to Loveland just for this show. Sunday morning, we took off for Rapid City, SD for the Road Tour. We were looking forward to meeting up with friends and acquaintances made over the last several years. There are quite a few people who do the tour every year. That evening we all went to a Mexican Restaurant for dinner.

Monday the 9th we officially got on the road. We visited Revision Rods and Rides located in Rapid City, then drove to Mount Rushmore. We spent some time there, then drove through Custer State Park where we saw a large herd of Bison (better known as Buffalo). they were way out in the field, so no closeups. We then drove Needles Highway, which is quite windy, narrow, and beautiful. An optional stop was Crazy Horse National Monument which we did not do. Our destination was Deadwood City, SD. Our hotel was in what used to be a mining company building.

On Tuesday we continued west to Sturgis to visit the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Saab Heritage Car Museum. The Saab Museum was much more interesting than I would have imagined. It included a

1965 3 cylinder 2-stroke Saab that was donated by a couple from Albany, OR. In 2021 they drove it from Albany, OR to Albany, NY and back. We then headed to Devil's Tower (if you've never seen it) it is a vertical round rock formation with a flat top that shoots straight up into the air. It is worth visiting if you are in the area. On the way we stopped at Aladdin General Store which is Wyoming's oldest General Store and sits out in the middle of nowhere.





The last stop for the day was Frontier Auto Museum and Café located in Gillette, WY. This is a family-owned museum that is a must see for those interested in gas and oil memorabilia, old cars, and many other collectibles. I've visited a lot of museums and collections over the years and this is one of my favorites.

Wednesday was basically a driving day which took us through Yellowstone National Park and Grand Teton National Park on our way to Jackson, WY where we stayed for two nights. We got some rain that evening with the

promise for more rain on Thursday. Because of the weather, we decided not to go back to Yellowstone, although many in the group did much to the regret of one couple from Iowa who ended up getting T-boned. They were driving a very nice early 1961 Chev PU and were hit directly in the driver's side door. Thankfully, no one was hurt, and the vehicle was still drivable and they were able to drive it back home without incident. Darrel and I took a shuttle bus ride to Teton Village which is a ski resort, then a bus to downtown Jackson where we had lunch at Bubba's BBQ.

Friday, we left for Idaho Falls. Our first stop was Legacy Flight Museum in Rexburg, ID. It featured military planes and memorabilia from World War II and Vietnam. Our second stop was the Idaho Potato Museum and Café in Blackfoot, ID where we ate lunch which was all about potatoes of course. Our third stop was Blackbird Rods in Shelly, ID. We stayed overnight in Idaho Falls. We drove downtown that evening to look at the falls which were rather interesting.

Saturday was our final road tour day. Our first stop was Craters of the Moon National Monument. It is on Highway 20/26 and worth visiting. Our second stop was Benny'z Rod Shop in Hailey, ID which is just south of Sun Valley. It seems like an out of the way place for a rod shop, but in talking to the owner I found out many of his clients are wealthy people who fly into Hailey on their way to Sun River. He said he ends up building multiple cars for many of them. The airport is near his shop. Our last stop of the day was to tour was Kenny's Rod Shop in Boise. It was a very nice shop with some very highend builds. We finished the evening saying goodbye to old friends and new acquaintances.

Sunday morning, we headed for home after having breakfast at Mr. V's in Caldwell, a 50-year-old family-owned restaurant currently operated by the 3rd generation. The food and service were excellent. I would recommend it if you are in Caldwell looking for a place to eat. Just west of Burns/Hines, OR we ran into some heavy rain for a while. We made it home safely and trouble free. It was a great trip.
