

2016 PITC Survey Overview

41 surveys - 65 individuals - 20 children

- **52% female, 48% male**
- **5% Hispanic, 92% Non- Hispanic;**
- **14% Black, 74% White, 2% American Indian, 6 % Multi-race and 4% other**
- **98% Sheltered, 2% unsheltered**
- **56% of families/persons experienced homelessness for the first time**
And the length of time they were homeless was:
 - 4% less than a week
 - 7% more than a week less than 1 month
 - 44% 1-3 months
 - 7% 4-6 month
 - 7% 7-12 months
 - 7% more than a year
 - 22% unknown
- **32% were previously homeless in the last 3 years.**
 - 9% experienced homelessness once
 - 45% experienced homelessness twice
 - 18% experienced homelessness three times
 - 27% experienced homelessness 4 or more timesTheir length of time homelessness was:
 - 7% less than a week
 - 7% more than a week but less than 1 month
 - 38% 1-3 months
 - 43% 4-6 month
 - 1% 7-12 months
 - 7% more than a year
 - 7 did not respond
- **The primary reason for homelessness**
 - 19% Domestic violence
 - 5% Mental Illness
 - 2% Substance Abuse
 - 0% Disability
 - 7% Unemployed
 - 5% Underemployed
 - 17% Eviction
 - 0% Dual diagnosis
 - 14 % Family issues
 - 17% Previous prison
 - 5% Did not answer

- **71% Individuals, 11% Single parent household; 1% Two parent household; 0% couples**
- **Householders identified these disabilities:**
 - 5% Mental Illness
 - 2% Alcohol/Substance Abuse
 - 3% physical disabilities
 - 1% undisclosed
- **35% employed, 58% unemployed, 10% unknown**
- **0% served active duty in the US Armed Forces**
- **With the following ages:**
 - 32% below 18 yrs. of age,
 - 5% 18- 24,
 - 63% 25 or older,
 - 2% unknown
