

2017 PITC Survey Overview

43 surveys/households - 74 (adults + children), 25 (children only)

- **42% female, 54% male, 4% no answer**
- **5% Hispanic, 62% Non- Hispanic, 33% no answer**
- **9% Black, 78% White, 3% Multi-race and 10% no answer**
- **89% Sheltered, 11% unsheltered**
- **40% of households (17/43) experienced homelessness for the first time**
 - And the length of time they were homeless was:
 - 17% less than a week
 - 24% more than a week less than 1 month
 - 35% 1-3 months
 - 12% 4-6 month
 - 0% 7-12 months
 - 12% more than a year
 - 0% unknown
- **58% of households (25/43) were previously homeless in the last 3 years.**
 - 28% experienced homelessness once
 - 36% experienced homelessness twice
 - 12% experienced homelessness three times
 - 20% experienced homelessness 4 or more times
 - 4% unknown

Their length of time homelessness this time was:

 - 8% less than a week
 - 12% more than a week but less than 1 month
 - 20% 1-3 months
 - 16% 4-6 month
 - 32% 7-12 months
 - 8% more than a year
 - 4% No Response
- **The primary reason for homelessness**
 - 4% Disability
 - 7% Substance Abuse
 - 26% Domestic Violence
 - 7% Unemployed
 - 9% Underemployed
 - 7% Mental Illness
 - 0% Child Abuse/Neglect
 - 7% Released from Prison
 - 0% Dual Diagnosis
 - 0% Natural Disaster
 - 7% Eviction
 - 0% HIV/AIDS
 - 26% Other
 - 0% Doesn't Know/Refused

- **61% Individuals, 30% Single parent household; 2% Two parent household; 7% couples**

- **Householders identified these disabilities:**
 - 21% Mental Illness
 - 16% Alcohol/Substance Abuse
 - 2% Physical Disabilities
 - 12% Undisclosed
 - 49% None

- **9% served active duty in the US Armed Forces**

- **With the following ages:**
 - 0% below 18 yrs. of age
 - 7% 18- 24
 - 93% 25 or older
 - 0% unknown
