45 surveys/ households - 75 (adults + children)

- 57% female, 43% male Adults
- 54% female, 46 % male Children
- 98% Non- Hispanic
- 8% Black, 86% White, 4% Multi-race and 2% no answer
- 63% Sheltered, 37% unsheltered
- 45% of households experienced homelessness for the first time
- 55% of households previously homeless in the last 3 years.

- o 27% 1 to 3 months
