

2014 PITC Survey Overview

55 surveys (2 observed)

- 64% female, 34% male
- 5% Hispanic
- 9% Black, 78% White, 8% Multiple Race
- 79% Sheltered, 15% unsheltered, 3% other homeless situation
- The length of homelessness:
 - 13% less than a week
 - 17% less than a month
 - 14% less than 3 months
 - 14% less than 1 year
 - 13% more than a year
 - 2% unknown
- The primary reason for homelessness
 - 36% Domestic violence
 - 8% Mental Illness
 - 8% Substance Abuse
 - 8% Disability
 - 9% Unemployed
 - 4% Underemployed
 - 4% Eviction
 - 4% Dual diagnosis
 - 8% Did not answer
- 62% Individuals, 31% Single parent household; 4 % Two parent household; 2% couples
- The following disabilities were identified
 - 27% Mental Illness
 - 7% Alcohol
 - 2% Substance abuse
 - 20% physical disabilities
 - 5% long-term diagnosed illness (cancer, etc.)
- 25% employed, 62% unemployed, 7% unknown
- 4% less than high school, 4% some high school, 30% high school/GED, 18% some college, and 2% college degree, remainder unknown
- 1% served active duty in the US Armed Forces
- 44% below 18 yrs of age, 4% 18- 24, 47 % 25 or older, remainder unknown
