

About BOLFP:

Bread Of Life Feeding Programme is a community based project that is established by Supernatural Kingdom Ministries to serve as a platform and place to contribute and assist the underprivileged group. This project welcomes all clients from the destitute and poor background to receive the food donation lunch boxes from SKM in order to feed their hunger.

No. of Clients

75-100 sets of lunch boxes will be allocated at each day's lunch session to cater to 100 pre-registered clients on a first-come first-served basis.

Registration

All clients who arrive to collect the lunch box must properly register their full names, Identification Card number, and contact number where available, prior to collection of food. This is for documentation and audit purposes as well as a requirement from Inland Revenue.

Operating Days & Hours

3 days of the week (Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays) will be selected to operate the Lunch Box for the Hungry project.

On each of the selected days, a booth consisting of tables will be setup at SKM's front façade for the registration and food distribution, which is targeted to run from 11am until 1pm, or until all the lunch boxes, have been distributed, on a first come – first serve basis except for clients with medical conditions.

Project Overview

Supernatural Kingdom Ministries is a fully registered charity (NO: 1273) under the Barbados Charity Act, CAP 243. It is enormously an Apostolic - prophetic dynamic young and fast growing ministry mandated to advance the gospel of the Kingdom of God in All the Earth.

Bread of Life feeding Programme (BOLFP) is a project initiative of Supernatural Kingdom Ministries. It is community service project and a collective effort among the concerned, caring, compassionate and loving people to help the poor and those in need.

We believe that homeless and marginalized individuals are capable of change and will only achieve their full potential when offered a safe, supportive, empowering and non-judgmental environment – it is our vision to provide such an environment and meaningful activities which will help reverse the spiral of homelessness. BOLFP does more than help the poor survive. It offers them hope for the future in many ways, including: Weekly (3 days a week for now) supply of hot meals and pantry bags to meet the basic survival needs. We plan to supply blankets and toiletries for those living on the streets. With your support, we plan to provide not just meals, but basic necessities like milk, diapers, clothing, and health services to the homeless,

Our aim is to feed the hungry individuals around designated areas of Eagle hall, Bank hall, Black Rock and Bridgetown. In addition to that, we would like to raise awareness on these less fortunate among the locals. We desire to include public's contribution as a big part of what makes our project a success.

Contributing to the improvement of homelessness and feeding the hungry is one of the existing long-term goals for BOLFP Outreach. SKM has for a few years been providing a safe daily environment for any homeless person to have access to a hot nutritious meal.

Our goal is feeding the hungry in our community. We serve the homeless, unemployed, elderly, migrants and the working poor. Everybody who comes to us for assistance is welcome regardless of race, sex, age, color, national origin, religious preference, special needs or income.

We strive to reduce hunger by preparing and providing one hot meal per day, 3 days a week for now due to funding constraints although we have future plans to serve our community daily.

How can you help?

BOLFP Outreach can only reach its vision with the help of funding or donations, the most critical of which are:

- One hot daily meal for 75-100 people daily (Mondays; Wednesdays and Fridays for now)
- Donations towards the meal are also welcome and can consist of the following items:
 - Pap (Maize meal), Sugar, Beans, Rice, Samp, Chicken Pieces, Mincemeat, Soup Packets, Sour milk, Vegetables and Fruits
 - Communication needs: telephone services, internet services, computers, laptops and printer/fax/scanner (for documenting our processes.
- Car and a panel van will help greatly

Through Bread of Life Feeding Programme, we aim to provide substantial and meaningful assistance to people who face difficulties in their life. Individually, we may not be able to change the world to become the one we want to live in but we may be able to help people substantially on an individual or community level. As a result, our core value is making charitable giving a part of everyone's life.

Executive Summary

The project's mission is to be the ultimate charity platform of choice to connect contributors, volunteers, and beneficiaries with the end result being making charitable giving a part of everyone's life. Our caring target includes underprivileged families, dialysis patients, orphanages, old folks home, person with disability, and others.

The "Bread of Life feeding Programme" is a food donation project that aims to feed the hungry, destitute, and poor souls living within the vicinity of Supernatural Kingdom Ministries so that we may help change these people's lives for a better tomorrow. Free lunches will be given out to walk-in people in the form of pre-packed lunch boxes at our Church Premises every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of the week.

Our Core Objectives are:

- To provide food in the form of lunch boxes to feed the hungry, destitute, and poor with the hope that it may somehow ease their burden and help change their lives for a better tomorrow.
- To act as a platform for members of the public who are interested in food donation charity project to participate along as volunteers and donors.
- To minister the gospel of salvation to the needy and underprivileged.

As a charitable organization, we have assigned this community service project based on the theme 'Giving Back to the Community'. There are various ways in giving back to the community; through volunteering, nonprofit organizations, and charity or public contributions to name a few. Over the recent years there are tremendous amount of measures taken by the government, non-profit organizations, the public and other parties as efforts in easing the burden of unfortunate communities among Barbadians. These charity projects often cater to orphanages, the elderly, animal shelters and more unfortunate communities out there.

The community chosen for this assigned project is the homeless individuals. Homeless people are individuals without a home who live on the streets of our city. The community includes single adults, families and children. There are numerous well-known people and non-profit organization that have been involved in organizing programmes to feed the homeless in Bridgetown. We commend them; however they can only make a limited contribution. The number of homeless is increasing and yet the service providers remain a few. With the growth of homeless people in Barbados, we should extend a helping hand to reduce the burden of the homeless.

In the recent years due to economic crisis there have been an increasing amount of homeless citizens in Barbados, including those who have jobs but do not earn enough to rent a room or house. They sleep on the streets of popular areas in Bridgetown and nearby suburbs like Eagle Hall. According to our initial research, there are various factors causing these homeless individuals to become victims on streets. A wide range of factors ranging from family issues to financial difficulties. Contrary to the common belief, there are many people that may seem presentable and well-dressed however still leaves in the streets. Among this group are those who are destitute with no means of supporting themselves, beggars and vagrants, drug addicts, mental patients and even those who have jobs but cannot afford housing. We have seen tremendous amount of efforts being shown as helping hand to ease the burden of these homeless individuals. However, even with the birth of homeless shelters that the government may provide most especially during rainy seasons, there are still insufficient amount of shelters to accommodate these unfortunate individuals. Constant measures and contributions are also taken by respective NGOs. These NGOs provide food and other basic necessities such as medical check-up and clothes to these unfortunates. There are cases in which contributions are made by other companies or other parties through these NGOs apart from collaborating with each other.

Introduction:

BOLFP continues to improve and grow. We are able to engage people who are difficult to reach and we regularly take referrals for people who want help with their substance misuse, signpost and give advice and information.

BOLFP is a safe and efficient project, well managed and effective. It provides a co-ordinated and positive meeting point for all kinds of people, vulnerable and otherwise.

The sense of community it engenders provides much needed solace to the isolated

Workers and volunteers have a non-judgmental and friendly approach that enables people to feel good about asking for help.

It's a one stop shop for a person in crisis who can access help at any time.

To have so many kinds of people, some of whom can be volatile, meet and eat in the same space is an achievement to be applauded.

BOLFP Food distribution for lunch often begins in the morning at around 11:00 am at the Church but we expect to buy a tent which we shall put at the back of the church to deal with this project. In the future we plan to serve breakfast, lunch and supper. Currently we employ volunteers consisting of students, working individuals and members of the Church themselves. We are currently planning to serve at least 75 – 100 individuals per day.

In the midst of distributing drinks and food to the few we currently serve, we also had the chance to have a little chat with one of the homeless individuals in our care. From the conversation, we gained informative insights on the homeless individuals and areas around Bridgetown. We were also able to identify shortages on certain basic necessities. As informed, there is shortage of basic necessities such as hygiene kits (toothbrush, toothpaste and soaps etc). This kind of feedback gave us a heads up on what to expect and not to expect when conducting our Bread Of Life feeding project; the do's and don'ts to follow in order to ensure a smooth operating process.

Background of the Project:

The purpose of conducting this project is to highlight the desire to correct or resolve a large problem or community concern. For example, "improvement of the human condition," "end homelessness" and "feed the hungry" are all statements of purpose. While these are desirable aims, they are extremely broad in perspective. Almost anything one might do could be considered contributing to the achievement of these purposes. One could make a contribution to a homeless kitchen/shelter, buy food at a retail store and give it away on the street, give money to another organization already working in this arena, or even raise funds to donate to an organization serving this purpose. One might even limit personal consumption of food. Purpose alone offers little ability to assess or determine if these actions effectively contribute to the achievement of the grand vision.

Other Objectives:

In order to advance BOLFP's aims and objectives, our plan has been to:

- ❖ Work, via our drop-in facilities, with individuals above the age of 16 (and their families and friends where appropriate) who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, exclusion or disadvantage because of their lifestyles, and to support the resolution of any issues they may have with substance abuse.
- ❖ Provide activities which help individuals to develop life skills in literacy, numeracy, IT and financial management and to gain self-esteem, confidence and a sense of wellbeing through meaningful recreational pursuits and therapies. Thereby, enabling them to move on in their lives away from dependency into self-sufficiency via employment, education or training.
- ❖ Raise local awareness of the needs of the homeless and socially excluded people, and increase the ownership of the project by the community.
- ❖ Generate funds for all of the above by charitable or commercial means.

BOLFP's Mission Statement:

- ❖ Provide a warm, safe, non-judgmental environment.
- ❖ Use these relationships to promote growth in guests' self esteem, confidence and aspirations.

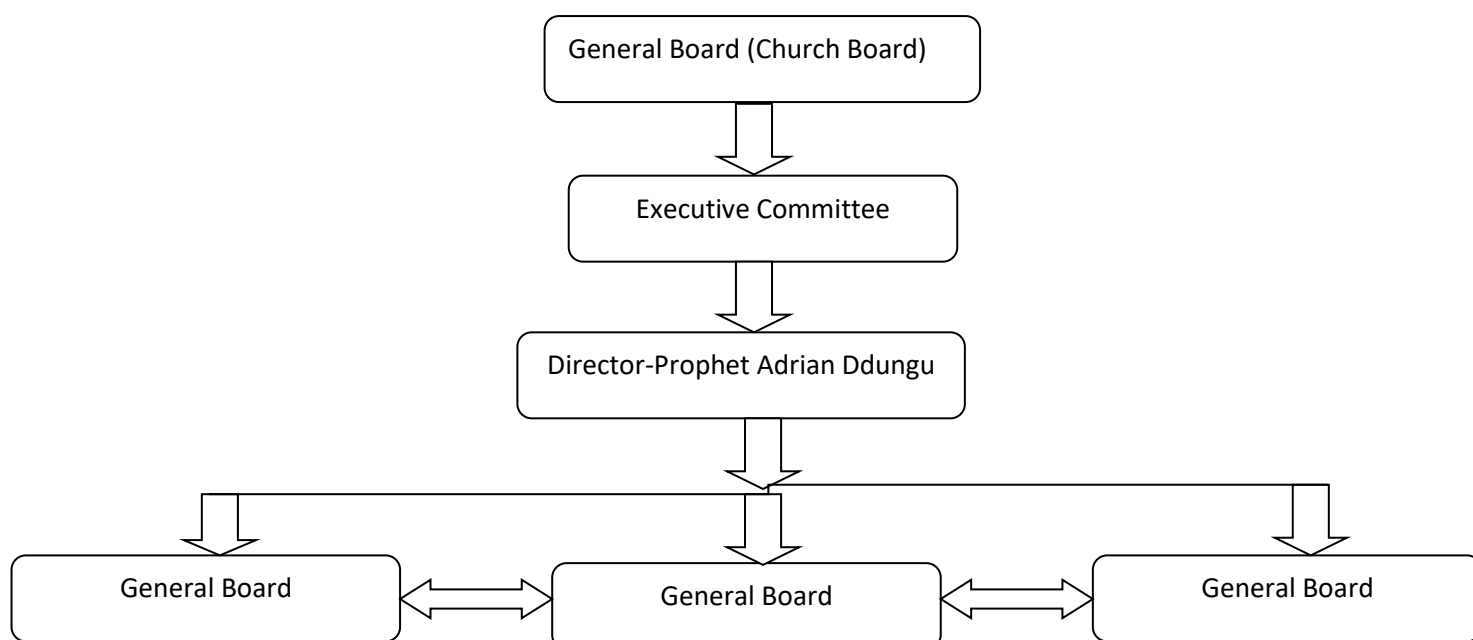

Each pack of lunch box will cost BBD .20 per packet.

Therefore, each session will cost: BBD 20 x 100 packs = BBD 20.00 Each week, there will be three sessions. The total cost for the 6 months duration of the project: BBD 20.00 x 3 sessions/week x 26 weeks = BBD 9360.00
