

The Mirror

“For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known.” -1 Corinthians 13:12 (NRSV)

What image do you see when you look in a mirror? Who is that person in the reflection?

They will keep us from transforming into the image of Christ. Sometimes we look through this mirror when we are stressed, depressed or wondering why God would ever use a sinner like me.

We need to quit looking in that warped mirror and see ourselves the way that God sees us.

If we are called to be in the image of God, why should we think that we are going to be a failure? We need to look into the perfect mirror to see the real person that we are.

The only perfect mirror is the Word of God and the Holy Scriptures.

The perfect image is Jesus.

Only a perfect mirror can give you a perfect image.

Let us pray: O merciful Father May our image be transformed to that of Christ. May we see ourselves and others through your loving eyes. May we be transformed into that same image and be taken from glory to glory. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.
