2022 Gymkhana Award Series

The 2022 12 Event Award Series will run June to October. To qualify for an award you must ride in 10 out of 12 events.

Riders will be split between 3 divisions:

Main Event - Adults & Experienced Kids
(See matrix online for divisional times)

Future Champions - Reserved for those riders just starting to be able to control the horse on their own. Due to their inexperience, they are just getting used to controlling the horse and navigating the course at the same time. Riders at this level may need coaching from the ground. The course has the same obstacles but is shortened.

Leadline - Reserved for those riders just starting out & are being led or riding in the saddle with an experienced equestrian. The riders in this division are unable to adequately control the horse on their own due to age, stature, or disability. The course has the same obstacles but is shortened.

Q&As about CMSA Mounted Shooting:

What is CMSA?

Cowboy Mounted Shooting Association® is the Fastest Growing Equestrian Sport in the Nation. Mounted contestants compete in this fast action timed event using two .45 caliber single action revolvers each loaded with five rounds of specially prepared blank ammunition. The Cowboy Mounted Shooting Association "C.M.S.A." has a variety of levels of competition for everyone, ranging from novice levels to the seasoned professional

What type of guns are used?

Mounted Shooters use .45 caliber single action revolvers like those used in the late 1800's. Single action revolvers must be cocked each time before firing by drawing the hammer back and CMSA limits competitions to single action revolvers.

Do you use live ammunition (lead bullets) or bird shot?

No. The cartridges fired are called .45 caliber Long Colts. The brass cartridge is loaded with black powder (like that used in the 1800's). This load will break a balloon up to about 15 feet. Live rounds are strictly prohibited at competitions.

How about scoring?

The riders are scored on time and accuracy. There is a 5 second penalty for each missed balloon, a 5 second penalty for dropping a gun, a 10 second penalty for not running the course correctly and a 60 second penalty for falling off your horse. Speed is important, however, accuracy is usually more important than speed. A typical pattern can be run in 15-35 seconds, so penalties can really hurt.

Are there horse requirements like breed, or registration?

No. You can use any horse or mule that you want. Some horses take to this sport easily, others do not. It is up to your horse's temperament and your desire to train him or her to get used to shooting, turning, and going fast. Some riders will use earplugs for themselves and their horses.


