ELECTIONS

President: Preside at all club and board meetings. Secure committee heads for all club committees.

Vice President: Preside at meetings when the President is absent. Handle all facility rentals (mobile home and clubhouse rentals). Oversee membership renewals.

Secretary: Keep a written record of the minutes from all official meetings. Keep membership records. Handle correspondence, maintain PO Box, purchase postage and materials needed for communications and club needs. Maintain receipts for money brought into the club.

Treasurer: Receive all club monies from Secretary, keep records of monies received, deposit and issue checks and paying bills. Prepare and record State and Federal reports, make monthly and annual financial reports.

Horse Event Representative: Plan and carry out or appoint someone to carry out horse event functions for the club.

Parade Marshall: Arrange parades that the club participates in, direct the members at parades and safeguard the welfare of the association during parades.

Custodian: Oversee general maintenance and repairs of club properties, schedule and organize work days.

Senior Advisor to Juniors: Plan and put on activities including meetings for members under the age of 18. Represent all youth members under 18 at the Board of Directors meetings.

Club Directors: There shall be 4 directors voted in who sit on the board helping make decisions for the club, helping where needed.

SJVR has other positions that are not filled by elections. These are committee positions and if you are interested in helping, these are the positions we are looking to fill:

Sunshine: Send out cards to members as needed.

Arena Boss: Oversee the arena needs for events-does not have to do all the work themselves-but arranges for it to be done.

Do you love trail riding? Trail riding is an great activity to take part in with your horse.

1. Trail Riding Is Freeing

encounter different situations with every ride. Your horse will need to listen to you as you ask him to navigate obstacles like fallen trees or running water. Trail riding is a great way to put your horse's training to the test.

3. Trail Riding Lets You Enjoy Nature

Trail riding can be a great chance for you and your horse to enjoy nature. Trailer out to different locations to get beautiful views of the world, and keep an eye out for the wildlife that you may meet along your way.

4. Trail Riding Gives You and Your Horse a Mental Break

If you have been intensely training your horse for an upcoming event, then perhaps it's time for a trail ride. Training takes a mental toll on both you and your horse, and intense athletic activity can also be mentally draining.
