BARREL RACING NEWS

Around the world, exciting things are happening in barrel racing. Hailey Kinsel took home her fourth World Champion title at the 2022 NFR.

Locally, Karissa Borba and Jennifer Homer have volunteered to help run the 4D barrel program and are excited learn the hosting side of barrel racing.

Recently some of our SJVR family has competed at the Vegas All In race, Ceres NFR race, Pants on Fire race, the Redbluff New Years race, and they make SJVR proud! Milla Mendoza had an great run in Vegas that sent her to the finals where she won \$1,400, Madi Gliege took home over \$1,750 at the POF race, Conner Leifried took home a checks and ran a 14.6 on a shortened course, Sandra Sirzzotti won a buckle at 3K barrels, and Jennifer Bonesteel won a back on track blanket during a 3K series.

We are also very proud of our long time member, Sierra Minatre. Sierra recently moved to Montana to complete her bachelors in animal science with an equine focus. In 18 short months, she will be applying to vet school and hopes to be accepted to Washington State Veterinary. While in Montana, she hopes to continue her love of riding and other outdoor sports.

Prior to leaving, she competed at several barrel races on a horse that had just been introduced the barrel patterns that year and she kept up with horses with far more experience.

The 2023 Gymkhana season is just a few short months away. This year we will not be hosting a buckle series but will be starting the 12 week series in April. In order to be eligible for awards at the end of the year, riders must ride in 10 of the 12 gymkhanas within the same division (Main, Future Champions, or Leadline) and riders in the main event must ride the same horse. Riders wishing to participate without award eligibility or wanting to condition a new horse, can ride 1-6 time only events per show at a lesser cost.

Divisions:

Main Event - Adults & Experienced Kids (See matrix for divisional times)

Future Champions - Reserved for those riders just starting to be able to control the horse on their own. Due to their inexperience, they are just getting used to controlling the horse and navigating the course at the same time. Riders at this level may need coaching from the ground. The course has the same obstacles but is shortened. Once a rider has placed as Champion or Reserve Champion, they will be no longer eligible to ride in the Future Champion Division.

Leadline - Reserved for those riders just starting out & are being led or riding in the saddle with an experienced equestrian. The riders in this division are unable to adequately control the horse on their own due to age, stature, or disability. The course has the same obstacles but is shortened.

2023 SCHOLARSHIP

Anyone wishing to continue their education is eligible to be awarded the SJVR scholarship. Must show current enrollment in college or a qualified institution of continued education. San Joaquin Valley Rangers offers up to two educational scholarships in the amount of up to \$1,000 per person depending on funds available. Eligible recipients are a high school senior or individual 18 years or older who is pursuing any field of study and will be attending a 4 year, 2 year or vocational school. Scholarship applications are due on April 15 and can be found on our website at sjvr.info under scholarships.
