To qualify for end of year awards, riders must ride 10 out of 12 events on the same horse (Leadline can ride any horse) Riders can pick any one day and ride for double points to make up for an absence. Double points must be signed up in advance.

Leadline - Reserved for riders that are unable to ride independently and need led \$20/day to qualify for awards or \$15/day for time onlys

Future Champions - Reserved for those riders just starting to ride independently and may need assistance \$25/day to qualify for awards or \$15/day for time onlys

Open - Adults and Experienced riders. Riders will place in division based on event time \$30/day to qualify for awards or \$15/day for time onlys

This outing served as valuable training, allowing the scouts to build endurance, test their gear, and gain experience in a pack-in environment similar to what they'll encounter at Philmont.

SJVR is excited to continue to promote the joy and benefits of trail riding through our Trail Ride Award Program—designed to encourage riding as a healthy activity for both horses and riders. Whether you own one horse or ride borrowed mounts, this program welcomes all participants to log their trail hours and work toward fun, custom SJVR rewards. It also helps us build a valuable database of parks, trails, and riding opportunities, which will be available as a resource on our website.

Participants can accumulate hours riding in parks, along levees, through neighborhoods, or during events like endurance rides, parades, trail trials, and poker rides. Arena time and prep work don't count—but the time spent out enjoying the trail does! Riders track their hours using official SJVR forms and submit them quarterly to the Trail Program Chair. As long as there's no break in membership or participation, hours are cumulative and count toward tiered annual awards ranging from caps and grooming sets to customized gear like saddle pads, bridles, and even buckles and jackets for higher milestones.

Sign up today and make your trail time count! Your rides will not only bring personal recognition but also contribute to our shared goal of growing the SJVR trail community and promoting accessible, outdoor fun for all equestrians.

Newcomers are encouraged to start at a comfortable pace, often trotting behind seasoned horses, before progressing to shooting. Open to all skill levels, these events provide a supportive, family-friendly environment where riders can develop new skills and connect with fellow horse enthusiasts. Whether you're just starting out or looking to refine your technique, SJVR's mounted shooting practices offer a fun, engaging way to grow as a rider.

Mounted shooting is one of the fastest-growing equestrian sports, blending horsemanship, speed, and marksmanship. Riders use specially loaded blank ammunition to shoot at balloon targets while maneuvering through a set pattern. The sport challenges both horse and rider to work as a team, requiring control, accuracy, and trust. It's a dynamic way to improve your riding, boost confidence, and experience the spirit of the Old West in a modern, competitive setting.
