Native Nebraskan and descendant of Czech immigrants, Janet Jeffries has bachelor's and master's degrees in American history from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Her areas of study include Nebraska history and the state's architectural history, Czechs in Nebraska, Czech costumes and folk art, genealogy, and other related topics. Jeffries directed a Czech studies Elderhostel program at Doane University for 18 years, owns a Czech costume collection that is exhibited periodically, and regularly leads tours to the Czech Republic. She also serves on the Czech Heritage Program Advisory Committee at UN-L. Jeffries is president of the Crete Heritage Society, and does exhibits and programming for that organization. She is the author of several articles on Crete and Doane University history, and wrote a pictorial history book Crete, released by Aracadia Publishing in their Images of America series. Jeffries, also a musician, performs a variety of music, including old time traditional and Czech, both solo and with The Kramer Sisters. Her professional career has been spent at the Nebraska State Historical Society, Doane University, and Berggren Architects.

UNL Komenský Club

The history of the **Czech Komenský Club** (named for **Jan Amos Komenský**, or **Comenius**, the pioneer educator, b. 3-28-1592 and d. 11-15-1670) is closely tied to Czech language instruction in Nebraska at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the cultural and political involvement of its members. Conceived in December 1903, and officially established in 1904, it became a nursery for influential personalities in Nebraskan political and cultural life, for example state and U.S. politicians Roman Hruška, Otto Kotouc, Joseph Vosoba, and Rudy Vrtiska; poets Ferdinand Musil, Jeffrey Hrbek, and Hrbek's sister the writer, translator, politician, and educator, Dr. Šárka Hrbková. Another member was Dr. Olga Šťastný, the organizer of the modern World Red Cross, and also one of the founders of the U.S. Association of Female Physicians in 1914. According to the club constitution, its aim was to form a bond among Czech-Americans and to provide a model of cultural association to other universities, where students could study and practice Czech language, learn about history, literature and share accomplishments of Czech culture. Komensky Club members are students at UNL but welcome members from the community to join. It invites speakers to present programs and lectures on Czech cultural and political themes.

UNL Czech Language and Studies Program

The University of Nebraska was one of the first universities in the United States to offer Czech language instruction. The Czech language and culture program was inaugurated in 1907, and has continued up until now except for a short interruption in the 1920s. The program has been a very successful one, thanks to its instructors and a number of outstanding students who have also been engaged in the programs of the Czech Komenský Club. The history of Czech language instruction in Nebraska is closely tied to the history of the club (named for Jan Amos Komenský, or Comenius, the pioneer educator, b. 3-28-1592 and d. 11-15-1670) at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and the involvement of its members. At present the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Czech Program offers three to four years of undergraduate instruction, and a minor in the Czech Language. It also offers several exchange programs between UNL and the Czech Republic.

The University of Nebraska Czech Studies have lasted over hundred years. From a program that was one among several in Nebraska it became the sole program in the whole state that teaches the language that draws students from other Nebraska institutions, and indeed from all the states in the U.S. University of Nebraska-Lincoln students of Czech have been professionally successful in their use of their language skills. They became translators, film makers, university professors, and diplomats. The program plays an important role in the state of Nebraska: upon the return to their communities of origin, the graduates organize new, or take over the existing cultural activities, that make life in Nebraska more interesting for many of its citizens. The Czech program students are also involved in the digitization of the Czech archival materials published on the Czech Heritage Project Site, that include oral history recordings and other materials researched or preserved by students of Czech. Paul Robitschek Student Exchange Program

Paul Robitschek originally wanted to donate couple of millions to the Charles University in Prague, but then sought an American university which would be willing to offer scholarships to Czech and Slovak students from the money he provided. Greg Jensen from University of Nebraska Foundation received his letter in 1996 and that's how the scholarship started. The money which the University of Nebraska Foundation received from Paul have been invested and coming scholars' scholarships are funded from the interest. Therefore the scholarship should exist for a long time to come. Since 1996 close to 40 Czech and Slovak students received the scholarship. Many Robitschek alumni are studying and working around the world and many are involved in the politics and cultural lives of the Czech and Slovak Republics. **Website: https://robitschek.org**



OUR LEADER: HANA WAISSEROVÁ, PH.D.

is an Assistant Professor of Practice of Czech Studies at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. She is also a fellow of the Harris Center for Judaic Studies, UNL, and a scholar in Czech and Central European cultural, gender, and literary studies. Over the years, she taught various courses focused on Gender and Central and Eastern European Studies. She earned a Ph.D. in transnational literature from Palacky University, CR, and Gender Graduate Certificate from TAMU, TX. Her current research interests include Central and Eastern European women, transnational literature, cultural memory, women's totalitarian experience, women's Holocaust experience, women dissidents, and literary ethnography. She has published numerous articles and book chapters. She has traveled widely in Europe, Asia, Africa, and Central America, and is much invested in promoting cultural sensitivity and global citizenship.

BOOK: THE JOURNEY (1977) AUTHOR: CECILIA STERNBERG

This thrilling memoir focuses on the life of Czech nobles from the Sternberg family told from the perspective of Cecilia. It retells the pre-war family life, as well as their aristocratic and wellconnected life prior and under Nazi occupation, and when Nazis confiscated their family home Častolovice. The story also tells how Count and Countess Sternberg with their daughter Diana fled Czechoslovakia as the Communists came to power in 1948 with the help of the American ambassador in Prague, Laurence Steinhardt. It is an important and well-written account of one important European noble families related to the Bismarks, who also witness complex diplomacies or divided loyalty among nobles prior the occupation of Sudetenland and during the Austrian Anschluss. It can be read as an alternative European history. The book also narrates with good humor how the family of these Czech refugees settled in New York, and how they faced their setbacks in the US. Eventually, they settled in St. Petersburg, Florida in 1952, where the countess sold homemade jewelry on the waterfront while the count sat in his underwear on the porch drinking wine and reading the Constitution of the United States before moving on to Jamaica.

This award will be presented at the State Czech-Slovak Queen Pageant. *Dr. Vladimiír Kučera* was an educator who taught Czech language classes at the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. He worked for the Nebraska State Historical Society and taught the Czech language in many small towns in Nebraska.

The requirements for this award are:

- 1. Persons who have promoted and preserved the Czech cultural heritage in Nebraska.
- 2. The award is limited to living persons at the time of the nomination.
- 3. They are not required to be of Czech descent
- 4. They are not required to be currently living in the State of Nebraska
- 5. They do not need to be members of a local chapter.
- 6. They will be asked to be present at the State Queen Pageant to be recognized and receive their award.
