

#### Susan Nagle, B.A.

Susan is a Wilber, Nebraska native. At age 6 years she met her 1st grade teacher Mary Greer selling raffle tickets at the first Wilber Czech Festival in August, 1962. She grew up helping prepare and serve food and bussing tables for the Wilber Sokols, United Methodist Church, United Methodist Youth Fellowship, Nebraska Czechs of Wilber, American Legion Auxiliary and FHA.

As a youth she helped construct and rode on floats for the Methodist Church and ZCBJ organizations.

Susan was a Sokol gymnast for 9 years, 1962-1971. She performed exhibitions in Wilber, NE; Wilson, KS and Cedar Rapids, IA. She was the youngest Wilber Sokol to compete in a District Meet in Berwyn, IL in June, 1969. She placed 3<sup>rd</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> in the Czech Days Talent Contest for her piano solos, as Bernice (Greer) Zajicek was her piano teacher. Susan and her brother Glenn learned the Beseda dance in 1966.

She has been a member of the Nebraska Czechs of Lincoln since May. 2016. She has served on the Publicity Committee distributing flyers in Lincoln, Wilber and Tabor, SD since 2019. She has baked kolaches and other "goodies" for the annual Bake Sale, and worked at the Bake Sale table. She is a member of the Czech Reading Circle since its inception in March, 2019. She was the committee member who coordinated the Wilber Alumni Band to play at Lincoln's 50th festival in 2019. She served on the Nominating Committee in 2023.

She holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Biology from Nebraska Wesleyan University. Her Minor was in the Humanities where her love for reading and writing was enhanced by completing 26 hours of English.

Susan and husband Mike and son Michael visited Prague, Czech Republic in March, 2005 during their European vacation.



### May 1st A Day for Love





Czechs do not traditionally celebrate Valentine's Day on February 14, but their day of love is May 1.

Czech poet, **Karel Hynek Macha** is known as *the poet of love*. He wrote a poem "Maj" (May). This famous poem celebrates the beauty of spring and tells the story of a tragic love.

Late evening, on the first of May—
The twilit May—the time of love.
Meltingly called the turtle-dove,
Where rich and sweet pinewoods lay.
Whispered of love the mosses frail,
The flowering tree as sweetly lied,
The rose's fragrant sigh replied
To love-songs of the nightingale.
In shadowy woods the burnished lake
Darkly complained a secret pain,
By circling shores embraced again;
And heaven's clear sun leaned down to take
A road astray in azure deeps,
Like burning tears the lover weeps.

If men from the neighboring village did not steal the maypole, the young men were able to visit the single women and bring them presents on May Day, May 1.

# May 8, 1945 The Liberation of Prague V-E Day (Victory in Europe Day)



Liberation Day is a national holiday in the Czech Republic. It is celebrated on May 8th each year.

This is the same date as the celebration known as V-E Day, VE Day or Victory in Europe Day that is celebrated across much of Europe.


As the names suggest, the day signifies the victory of the Allied forces against the Axis forces at the end of World War II in 1945. In particular, the Czech Republic celebrates Liberation Day as the day its people were freed from Nazi rule.

The day was originally celebrated on 9 May, but this was changed in 1989 to 8 May. Some people call the holiday Liberation from Fascism Day.

On May 8, with Allied troops approaching from west and east, the Czechs negotiated a cease-fire with the Germans. The situation was now critical; the Czechs lacked the machinery and the weaponry to continue fighting the Germans, and the city's Old Town was in flames.

Part of the cease-fire was a guarantee, from the Germans, that the city would not be harmed further. The Czechs knew that, with help on the way, the cease-fire would be far more beneficial to them than it seemed on the surface.
