SEPTEMBER 28 A Public Holiday in the Czech Republic





In the **Czech Republic, September 28** is actually two holidays on one day. The day celebrates the creation of the Czech Republic state. So the holiday is called **Czech Statehood Day**.

The day also celebrates **Saint Wenceslas**, the Duke of Bohemia (born A.D. 907) who is the patron saint of what is today, the Czech Republic. Wenceslas was a Christian who ruled with dignity, kindness, and piety in a pagan world. He was assassinated on September 28, A.D. 935. The Holy Roman Emperor, Otto (912–973) elevated him to King after his death. We know him throughout the world as *Good King Wenceslaus*.

Take it one generation at a time - it can get overwhelming when you start diving into aunts, uncles, cousins take your time.

Don't trust everything you see in print. Editors of any documentation old or recent make mistakes unintentionally as well as intentionally. Misspellings and incorrect dates top the list. Some scribes will have inserted their own "slant" of information reporting that will confuse you. Use of nicknames is one example. Names of parents of illegitimate children on birth records is another... sometimes father names were "guessed or assumed" to be correct for the child in question.

If it's on the Internet, it must be true. Well, not quite... the internet is a valuable genealogy research tool, but internet data, like any other published sources, should be approached with caution & skepticism.



The license plate was designed by **Jim Cantrell**, a nationally recognized, independent studio artist who grew up west of Wilber, the Czech Capital of Nebraska and USA Czech Capital. He is now living in Bardstown, Kentucky.

The image captures the spirit of Czechs as they arrived and settled in Nebraska, helping to build our great state through hard work, dedication and commitment. The Czech National Flag flies in the background representing the historical connection, but the words at the bottom indicate their hopes and dreams to make Nebraska their new home.

The Czech Heritage Plate was conceived by Linda Taborek, Patti Fortik, and Debbie Spanyers. On January 6, 2023, LB 140 was introduced by District 32 Senator Tom Brandt, with co-signers District 3 Carol Blood, and District 46 Senator Danielle Conrad to provide for a Czech License Plate. After committee approval, the bill was presented to the Nebraska Legislature on February 8, 2024. Governor Jim Pillen approved it on February 13, 2024. Dr. Mila Saskova-Pierce, Honorary Consulate of the Czech Republic in Lincoln and the Department of Motor Vehicles were charged with completing the process. Dr. Mila Saskova-Pierce led a committee to finalize design details.
