January 1 New Years Day Restoration Day of the Independent Czech State

Wednesday, January 1, 2025 Restoration Day of the Independent Czech State

This is a public holiday in the Czech Republic that commemorates the day, January 1 in 1993 when Czechoslovakia was split into the Czech Republic and Slovakia. This has been referred to as *The Velvet Divorce*. When Communist rule in Czechoslovakia ended in 1989 resulting from the Velvet Revolution, negotiations began between the Slovak and Czech leaders. In November 1992, the federal parliament of Czechoslovakia voted to dissolve the country on December 31st 1992. So, on January 1, 1993, the two countries separated into the Czech Republic and Slovakia. They have remained close partners and share many traditions still today.:
