Pray to GOD for us, alleluia. v. rejoice and be glad, Virgin Mary, alleluia. R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia. (All pray) Let us pray: O God, by the resurrection of your Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, you brought joy to the world. Grant that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, his Mother, we may attain the joy of eternal life. We ask this through Christ Our

Lord. AMEN.

Chaplet of Devine Mercy

Opening Prayer: You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed froth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O fount of life, unfathomable Devine Mercy, envelope the whole world and empty yourself out upon us. O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a fountain of mercy for us, I trust in you.

(say) 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and 1 Apostle's Creed

Repeat these prayer sets 4 times – 4 decades

- (1 time) Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- (10 Times) For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After 4 decades, Repeat this prayer 3 times

Holy God, Holy Mighty one, Holy Immortal one, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Closing Prayer: O Blood and Water that gushed forth from the heart of Jesus, as a fountain of mercy for us, I trust in you. Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasure is compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will, which is Love and Mercy itself. AMEN.

Commandments

At this age, you should be learning to follow mass in the books in the pews and recite the common prayers. You should also be at mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation and develop personal devotions to patron saints.

Catholic Devotion

Devotions are external practices of piety, which are separate from the liturgy of mass, but are part of the spiritual practice of Catholics. Devotions can be: formal multi day prayers such as novenas or not include prayer but time such as Eucharistic Adoration outside of mass, wearing a scapula, or th veneration of saints.

The Virgin Mary is the most common example of a devotion to a saint. Other examples include: the rosary, The Way/Stations of the Cross, the Sacred Heart of Jesus, The Holy Face of Jesus, Devine Mercy, Infant of Prague, Various Scapulars, Immaculate Heart of Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe, Seven Sorrows of Mary, novenas to various saints, pilgrimages and devotions to the blessed sacraments, the veneration of saintly images and statues such as St. Anthony or St. Joseph.

You will research and choose a Patron Saint this year and write a report that includes the prayer to that saint. Your Patron Saint will be your Confirmation name next year.

The sacraments are a part of our journey to living with Christ.

1. Baptism - to remove the original sins of Adam And Eve – chosen for us

- by our parents who are accepting the responsibility of raising us in the faith. 2. Reconciliation – has three elements: conversion, confession, and
 - celebration. We are forgiven, so we must forgive others.
- 3. The Holy Eucharist receiving Jesus both physically and spiritually
- **4. Confirmation** the Act of accepting your faith and stepping forth armed with GOD by your choice
- 5. Holy Orders Heeding GOD's call to become a Priest or a Nun.
- 6. Holy Matrimony to marry in the church and accept children as gifts from GOD to be taught the faith.
- **7. Extreme Unction** the sacrament given during illness or at a time when there is imminent threat of death –a ritual of healing both spiritually and physically.
