Rule and Raven

In St. Benedict's left hand is his Benedictine Rule Book. On a pedestal to the right of St. Benedict is the <u>poisoned cup</u>, shattered when he made the sign of the cross over it. On a pedestal to the left is a raven about to carry away a loaf of poisoned bread that a jealous enemy had sent to St. Benedict.

Eius in obitu nostro praesentia muniamur! May we be strengthened by his presence in the hour of our death!

Benedictines have always regarded St. Benedict as a special patron of a happy death. He himself died in the chapel at Monte Cassino while standing with his arms raised up to heaven, supported by the brothers of the monastery, shortly after St. Benedict had received Holy Communion.
