PROPHETIC WORDS GIVEN AT ALTON DAY OF RENEWAL

Prophecy isn't primarily about telling the future. It's essentially giving us current insight into God's plan and His Word, calling us back to what's already been revealed in public revelation. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that although "Revelation is complete, it has not been made completely explicit; it remains for Christian faith gradually to grasp its full significance". (CCC66) Prophecy encourages us and reminds us of the heart of Christianity: of God's love, His mercy and forgiveness through Jesus and His presence with us through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The following words were given at Alton Day of Renewal, and we believe they are from the Lord. But they will not all be relevant for everyone: you need to pray to the Holy Spirit for discernment about whether God is speaking to you personally about something. We hope you find them inspiring, encouraging, or comforting. Although we have prayed and discerned that they are in line with Scripture and the teaching of the Church, please bear in mind that "Private revelations.... do not belong to the deposit of faith. It is not their role to improve or complete Christ's definitive Revelation, but to help live more fully by it in a certain period of history." (CCC67)

****We have discerned that the Words below marked with an asterisk are not strictly speaking prophecies, but are interesting observations.***

ALTON DAY OF RENEWAL WORDS OF PROPHECY 22/11/2025

First Word

This came following Father Anthony's homily, which was quite sobering. And I felt the Lord saying initially, "Do not be afraid. The path is narrow as you follow me, but I am the light of the world and my spirit illuminates my path so that you can always keep me in sight as I go before you. Have courage, little flock, I have chosen you; and even though Satan sifts you like wheat, I pray for you and have already conquered sin and death. Follow me each day and do not be afraid: you belong to me.

Second Word

I was praying during the Adoration time and the Lord gave me Psalm 43, particularly verse 3, "send forth your light and your truth; let them guide me". And that really goes perfectly with our theme today, when we're asking the Lord to make us into signposts to his kingdom. I think many of us probably feel, well, you know, why me? How can I be a signpost? And so on. But the Lord continued to speak to me through the Psalm, and He said: "Do not be downcast. Trust me to give you my light and my truth to be your guide, and to enable you to guide all who are lost and searching for me. I am the Lord your stronghold. I am your joy and your delight. Put your hope in me and praise me: I am your saviour and your God."

Third Word

Mine resonated with what was just said. I received this during the week, when I was looking up at the new comet that's in the sky. I felt the Lord saying: "When I created the world, I hung the stars in the sky to provide light upon the earth and to separate night from day. The starry host reflects not only my power and majesty, but also my care for mankind. In the darkest nights, the

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brighter stars are often highlighted, so that all the Earth can see my glory, be reminded of my loving presence.

“Do not be discouraged over the spiritual darkness that is creeping over the earth. Place your hearts and your lives into my hands and nothing will ever separate you from my love. I created the stars to shine my light upon the earth And in the same way, I'm calling each one of you, my beloved people, to shine brightly in this growing darkness.

“ as I know all the stars by name, so I'm calling you, each one of you, to shine where you are: in your communities, your families, churches, shopping malls, schools, hospitals, and all the places where I will lead you.

“Come to me. Let me draw you closer. Trust me in all the circumstances of your lives. Then, as the stars helped the ancients to navigate the Earth, your lights will be a beacon, guiding those who are lost to find my heart, so that they will repent and be saved.”

Fourth Word

“My brothers and sisters, speak to me in the silence of your hearts. Go no further than the altar of your local church to find me really and truly present in my Blessed Sacrament, the Sacrament of my love. Let my breath be upon you, to bring you to the full revelation of my presence with you.”

Fifth Word

From John 11:40 “I am the resurrection.”

Sixth Word

The word I had, first of all, was: “I am the light of the world.” And I did see a picture of the angel Gabriel. It just wouldn't go away, just kept coming. And then, it seemed like a cliché at the time, but then the manger, and baby Jesus, glowing in radiant light with Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds. Really close, but it was the fact that they were leaning into the crib as close as they could possibly get: captivated, held in the darkness of the night. And there was the light, glorious, unimaginable. It seemed to be about focusing on Him in the darkness, to focus on Him and not the darkness. Then I had the words after, “lean not on your own understanding, just deliver, do not be afraid.”

Seventh Word

I would like to confirm that word for you, because I had the guardian angels watching over the crib as well. And I also had: “Throw off the shackles that bind you. Rise up, a mighty army, gird yourself for the battle. Step out in faith to proclaim to the whole world that Jesus is Lord.”

Eighth Word

Although we are all different and may feel unequal, we are all equal in the sight of God, we all receive his light to guide us and encourage us in hope to love one another and not to be afraid.

Ninth Word

“Taste and see that the Lord is good.”

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Tenth Word

“Be still and know that I am the Lord!”

Eleventh Word

The words of the hymn –“Be not afraid, I go before you always; Come follow me and I will give you rest.”

Twelfth Word

Romans 12: 2 “Don’t let yourselves to be shaped by the world where you live, but rather be transformed through the renewal of your mind . You must discern the will of God: what is good, what pleases, what is perfect.”

Thirteenth Word

The piece of music: “Song of Hope.”

WORDS OF KNOWLEDGE FOR HEALING
