THE DIVIDE GOLF CLUB makes major upgrades to greens

Over the past two months golfers have anticipated a transformation of a well-known Matthews golf course starting with their greens. The Divide Golf Club closed the golf course on August 10th for renovations to Diamond Zoysia greens, and reopened for play on September 12th.

Diamond Zoysia resists extreme heat and because the grass is thicker, there are fewer if any ball marks making for a better putting surface.

The Divide Golf Club, deriving its name from the fact that it stretches across both Mecklenburg and Union Counties, has been appreciated for its traditional style layout designed by John Cassell II in 1995. Golfers of any skill level are now enjoying the spacious Bermuda fairways and large, renovated greens.

To add to the challenge, water comes into play on ten holes making

sure to keep golfers aware of their surroundings.

The 18-hole Divide course features 6,973 yards of golf from the longest tees for a par of 72. The course rating is 74.4 and it has a slope rating of 137. Pinnacle Golf Properties manages this facility with Boyd Everling PGA, as the General Manager.

The practice facility features a large 30 station turf driving range, putting green, pitching green and sand bunker for warm-up or practice sessions. The clubhouse offers banquet and dining facilities with indoor and patio seating.

With the outstanding addition of Diamond Zoysia greens to the golf course, golfers are finding that a return to the Matthews course has been a welcome change.

Carolin's PGA Jr. League Shootout Championship
