The newly remodeled full-menu ECHO restaurant has ocean-view indoor or outdoor seating and offers a delicious dining choice right on property. Chef de Cuisine, James Flack has taken local flavor to new heights. "We take pride in serving the very best local ingredients that Georgia has to offer. We use fresh Georgia shrimp, Georgia meats, local cheeses, Savannah Bee honeycomb, and

of course, Georgia peaches!"

The Resort is set on the south-east end of St. Simon's Island, with the King and Prince



Golf Club just minutes away on the north end of the island. Originally opened in 1989 and designed by Joe Lee, the course got a complete \$3.6-million makeover in 2009 restoring the course's original design but utilizing the latest surface technology.

Golf may be the lure to the King and Prince, but the enjoyment of St. Simon's Island on the Golden Isles doesn't end with the final putt.

- **Cap Fendig's Lighthouse Trolley Tours** is owned and operated by life-long resident Cap Fendig, whose family goes back to the mid 1800's. Take one of Cap's trolley tours to learn more about the area's unique history, secrets of the island and hidden getaways. Cap is passionate about the area and will captivate you with his stories of St. Simon's Island.



- **Bike paths** Rent a bike and set out exploring the island with its over 30 miles of bike paths. Cycle along paths surrounded by beautiful mossy live oaks, marshlands, river views and ocean views. You will pass historic markers and sites around every bend and may even see a tree spirit or two. Explore island treasures by cycling to the island's shopping hot spots - Pier Village and Red Fern Village.

- **St. Simon's Lighthouse and Museum** Climb 129 steps to experience the most spectacular views of the south end of St. Simons Island, neighboring Jekyll Island and the mainland (Brunswick). The current lighthouse and the lighthouse keeper's dwelling were rebuilt in 1872 after Confederate forces destroyed it in 1862. The red-brick dwelling, a unique Victorian design which draws the eye upward to the tower, houses a museum and gift shop.
