



Freeman Shelnutt Memorial Scholarship

A native of Troup County, Georgia, Freeman Shelnutt was a graduate of Berry College. Following graduation, Shelnutt taught at the Georgia School for the Deaf at Cave Spring for six years. For the next twenty-six years, he taught Language Arts at Armuchee High School, retiring in 1986. At the time of his death, Shelnutt was serving as President of the Armuchee Ruritan Club.

The Freeman Shelnutt Memorial Scholarship was created in Mr. Shelnutt's memory and is awarded annually to a graduating senior at Armuchee High School who has plans to pursue an undergraduate education at the college or university of their choice. Using criteria established by the club, a student may receive a grant based on academic achievement, financial need, community service, the applicant's pursuit of an education degree or a family member who was an educator. The amount of the award is based on the success of the club's fundraising activities.

Applications for the scholarship, which is currently \$2000, can be obtained from the Armuchee Ruritan website under the Scholarships tab and must be submitted to the Armuchee High School guidance counselor by March 10.

STEP 1: Print application from the Armuchee Ruritan website and fill out all the information requested.

STEP 2: Attach a one-page narrative describing your short and long-term goals.

STEP 3: Return to guidance counselor by March 10 and have a copy of your high school transcript attached.
